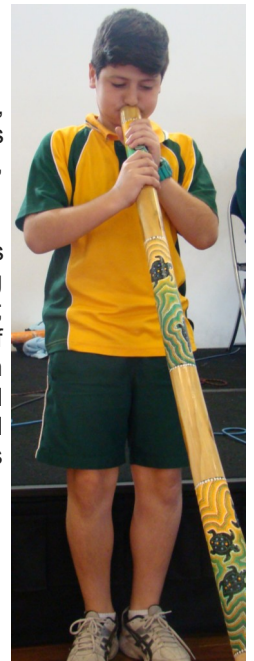

NATIONAL ABORIGINES AND ISLANDERS DAY OBSERVANCE COMMITTEE (NAIDOC) CELEBRATIONS

Last Wednesday the children welcomed 'Animals of the Dreaming' as part of NAIDOC celebrations, 'Animals of the Dreaming', is an educational program that Taronga Zoo implements in schools. As part of NAIDOC Celebrations Jarara Indigenous Education Unit offered this special program, free of charge, to St Patrick's students.

The theme for NAIDOC Week 2016 is: **Songlines: The Living Narrative of our Nation**. This theme highlights the importance of Song lines to the existence of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people; their strong spiritual and cultural connection to land and sea. The theme is an opportunity to pay respects to country; honour those who work tirelessly on preserving land, sea and culture and to share the stories of many sites of significance or sacred places with the nation. 'Animals of the Dreaming' is an interactive outreach program where students were able to: gain and insight into the Aboriginal Culture, develop and awareness and appreciation of the land and animals to Aboriginal people, meet a collection of live unique native animals and learn how they can help these amazing animals service.
