BEFORE SCHOOL DROP OFF

Now that we are into Term 2 I would like to remind families about some issues around safety before school. It has come to my attention that, while our Ross St gate is not unlocked until 8am, there are a number of students being dropped off well before this time and left unsupervised. I understand that some families have work commitments but this practice does not ensure the safety of your children.

If you do need to drop off at 8am please remind your child/ren that they are to sit in the amphitheatre until 8.20am when a teacher begins duty. At present some of our students are finding this a little challenging as they want to move around. If you do not need to drop your child off early please consider waiting until morning supervision begins at 8.20am.

If you are using the 'Kiss and Drop' zone outside the front of the school please use the parking zone available and not drop off in the school driveway. Please be mindful that after 8.30am the queue becomes quite long. Drivers getting out of their cars, assisting children with bags etc holds up the flow of traffic. Try and keep the drop off to a minimum.

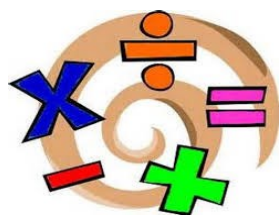

Catherine McAuley is now accepting enrolments for Year 7 2020.

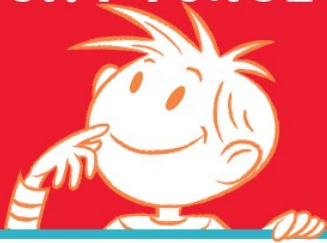

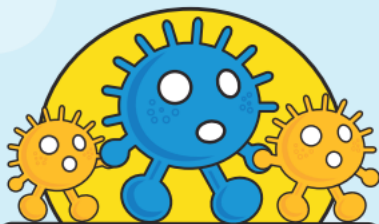
