Dear Parents

Last Sunday, children from our school received the Sacrament of Eucharist for the first time - their First Holy Communion, at Our Lady of Lebanon Church, Harris Park. This is the third group of children from our school to receive this very important sacrament, this year; the first group being those that attend St Patrick's Cathedral Parramatta. It is always wonderful to see all the children and their families, including their extended family, making this a priority on Sunday. For many children this will be a day they will never forget.

I know many Catholic adults remember their First Holy Communion. I certainly do. Like these children I was just 7 or 8 years old and unlike today our lessons were solely held within the school day with very little parent involvement regarding extra catechesis. Looking back I feel I was so lucky that our mother regularly embedded our faith into our daily lives. Attending mass every weekend it was just natural that one day it was to be our turn to receive Jesus in the Eucharist. We witnessed our parents receive communion every week, regularly received the sacrament of Reconciliation and enjoyed the gathering of family and friends outside St Anthony's Girraween. Faith that is only experienced at the school level cannot possibly have the same impact as that which is lived and spoken about daily at home. The catholic school plays a very important part in faith development however for faith to be sustainable and enduring it is best nurtured in the home first. I have often repeated an idea shared by a parish priest years ago when he surmised: 'if faith is only experienced at school then there is the likely danger, that the student takes off their faith when they take off their uniform'. It is this key principlewhich recommends that children's learning about the sacraments is best achieved through a Parish Based, Family Centred approach.

I know that all parents want their children to one day grow up to be kind, forgiving, generous, compassionate adults who will behave as good citizens in service of community. They want their children to be happy and have a love of God and one day, God willing, to have their own beautiful families. Who knows they may even send them to St Patrick's Parramatta.

Children are learning to become these adults, now, from you, their parents and family. If we wish them to attend church regularly and receive the Eucharist every Sunday we need to be demonstrating that now by taking them to Mass and by showing them what it looks like to be an adult Catholic who is active in their faith. We pray that over time we will see them actively choosing this life, while we watch with great satisfaction of a job well done.

Can I ask you all to keep in your prayers all the children who made their First Holy Communion this year and to pray that their families will continue to gift them with a faith that is true and active. May God continue to bless you in your role as parents and grant you wisdom, patience and hope in this, our next generation.





Future Care Mobile Dental Services

Information for Parents

What service is offered?

Future Care Mobile Dental Services is a unique initiative that provides high quality, on-site, general dental care to children aged 2-17. Under the Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS), funded by the Australian Federal Government, our service for eligible* students comes at no cost to the school or the parents

Who are the dentists?

Future Care Mobile Dental Services comprises of a team of accredited and experienced dentists with a keen desire to provide the essential dental care to your child.

What sort of services are provided?

After receiving written consent from you as their parent/guardian, your child will be provided the following services:

- Comprehensive oral examination and treatment plan
- Cleaning of teeth and fluoride application
- If applicable (and with further parental consent) on our return visit to your school x-ray, fillings, fissure seals, extractions if required

What does it cost?

Eligible students: *For eligible students the total benefit is capped at \$1000.00 over a two calendar year period. We confirm eligibility with Medicare prior to your child's consultation with our dentist.

Ineligible students: For students not covered under the CDBS we can provide the same level of preventative care for

Should X-Rays/fillings/fissure seals/extractions, etc. be required such will be detailed on the Treatment Plan that will be provided to your child. We normally return to the school to undertake this restorative work and contact all parents to explain what work is required and if agreed the child is booked into our clinic for our next visit. students who are ineligible to be Bulk Billed we provide the parent with a quote as per the CDBS bulk billed fee schedule. Payment is available via EFT/Credit Card/PayPal for your convenience.

How can my child participate in the program?

Your child can participate in the program after filling in our consent form and medical questionnaire. We need these returned prior to your child being seen by our dentist.
