Dear Parents and Caregivers

On Friday 30th August a number of our children joined students from other local parishes to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at St Patrick's Cathedral Parramatta. The Confirmation Celebrant was Bishop Vincent Long Van Nguyen with Father Bob Bossini and Father Christopher del Rosario concelebrating. Deacon Roderick Pirotta was also present.

In his homily Bishop Vincent congratulated all the children for reaching this part of their faith journey. He reminded them that they had now journeyed from their spiritual childhood to a state of fully fledged Christian lives. Bishop emphasized that this significant step - the receiving of the Sacrament of Confirmation - is not one that is a mere 1 hour service but one that lasts a lifetime. It requires a life of service in which we are called to accompany others on their journeys.

He related this journey to the same journey that Jesus took; a journey of service, commitment and mission.

He asked us to reflect on what type of lives do we wish to live; that of self indulgence, self centred, greedy, miserable lives OR Spirit filled and inspired lives filled with hope, joy, truthfulness, peace and love.

Bishop Vincent called on the children to remember that the world is in desperate need of the fruits of the Spirit which they have now received and that we can make a difference in our world - like a light on the hilltop. We have the potential to live Spirit lead lives; lives we are meant to produce.

May I take this opportunity to sincerely thank all the members of the choir who came to support the children making Confirmation and my deepest thanks to their parents in making this a priority on what I know was a very busy Friday. Your support of the school has not gone unnoticed and we very much appreciate your efforts. Thank you also to Mrs Rodricks for the time spent preparing the children and to Mrs Standring for her involvement with the Parish Sacramental Committee. Thank you to the staff for their support as always.


Let us ask the Holy Spirit to continue to bless our School Community of St Patrick's Parramatta, especially the children who have recently received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

UNIFORM

- Full school uniform is to be worn at all times.
- Uniforms and shoes should be clean and neat.

8. MOVING WITH MATHS

These ideas use movement of the body to experience counting:


- » Count each toss of the ball as you play a game.
