Dear Parents

Thank you once again to all the parents who attended the Parent/Information evenings for Years One, Three, Five and Six held so far this week. Kindy and Year 2 will be held tonight and Year 4 parent meeting is on Monday evening. A special thank you is extended to the teachers, for preparing and sharing a basic summary of the curriculum to be taught this year.

A common theme presented by our teachers is that of developing independence, a growth mindset and resilience in our children. Studies on children's attitude to learning are gaining great momentum and educationalists such as John Hattie speak about the impact of the learner's estimate of their own learning as an important factor in success.

Another form of prior achievement is students' estimates of their own performance – typically formed from their past experiences in learning. Students have reasonably accurate understandings of their levels of achievement... Their expectations of success (which are sometimes set lower than students could attain) may become a barrier for some students as they may only perform to whatever expectations they already have of their ability.

I often challenge the senior students by asking them the question, "Where are you in your learning vehicle?" For some they are definitely in the 'driver's seat'. These students will help to set the direction for the learning by taking responsibility for their achievements and challenges. They ask questions to clarify understandings so as to ensure their own success. They learn beyond what is set by the teacher, often in their own time and they embrace feedback because their primary goal is the learning. Performance is important to them but only for a short time until the next learning challenge comes along. Mistakes and inaccuracies are just indicators of the 'where to next' in the learning, not a 'who I am'. The growth mindset these children display will often determine the way they manage high school as they are used to taking ownership of their work habits and they have learnt to be self-reflective, that is, they are beginning to understand how they learn and how they can optimise this. Parents can often assist by never looking to outside factors to blame re their child's lack of success.

There are some students who are in what I call the 'passengers seat' of the learning vehicle. These students may vary their position from back seat to front seat depending on their mindset and confidence. Younger children understandably are often in the passengers seats because they still need the guidance and skills required for good learning skills and habits. Interestingly however teachers do see even younger students learning to be 'drivers' because they show such interest in making learning gains, not only to please teachers or parents but for themselves.

We can assist students to move into the most effective learning position by allowing them to take risks in their learning, which often means that they will make mistakes along the way. Not focusing on the 'failure' but rather on the achievements will encourage them to own their learning and not be frightened to get things wrong. Constructive, detailed feedback on how they can improve is essential however, just like that given to a learner driver. Adults, even teachers are often tempted to jump into the driver's seat for students by taking on the necessary effort and responsibilities required, but all this does is disempower them as learners.

Finally, 'what about those students who find themselves in the '**boot'** of the learning vehicle? I hear you ask. Yes as learners we can all sometimes go there. These students do not align themselves with the learning at all. The learning is someone else's task; teachers, mum or dad's perhaps. Our challenge for these students is to make learning relevant for them by ensuring that we find what interests them and use that as a springboard. This sometimes takes some creative thinking, however it is definitely achievable. Not crossing the boundaries of the learning is also important by asking ourselves, 'who is the learner here and what is their role, rights and responsibilities?' As we commence the learning for this new year it may be worth having a conversation with your children about where they would like to position themselves in the learning vehicle and how they can be supported in improving their own learning outcomes.

CHILD SAFETY DURING PICKUP



Dear Parents

Can I ask you to be vigilant about following safety rules around the pick up zone. We all realize that the areas around the school are very hectic in the afternoons and ask for your patience. On some days the traffic rolls smoothly and on other days it is a little slow. Please be mindful that our staff are often doing this duty in sometimes 40+ degrees temperature so as to enable children to be successfully picked up and so that parents do not have to get out of their cars. I am sure like me you

are extremely grateful to them for this service. I am also very grateful to Mr Stephen Walsh for placing a teacher on crossing duty to assist the flow

Just a few reminders please

- Please display your child's name clearly so that the teachers can read it from afar in thick permanent marker
- Never make a U turn along Ross Street. This is extremely dangerous.
- Please cross at the crossing
- Please do not leave your car to assist with bags. A car left running unattended can accidentally roll on your child or another person and holds up the drive through process
- If your child cannot manage their bag and seatbelt independently do not use drive through.

ENROLMENTS FOR 2017 KINDERGARTEN ARE NOW OPEN

Enrolment packs for Kindergarten 20167are available from the school between the hours of 9am -3pm Monday to Friday.

When you return the enrolment you will need to bring your child's original Birth Certificate, Baptismal Certificate, Passports (parent's and child's if born



overseas), Immunization Certificates and proof of address (council rates, drivers licence). We will photo copy these and return them to you at this time.

Enrolment forms are required to be returned by 31st March 2017.

ENROLMENT CRITERIA

Who can enrol in a Catholic school?

Children whose fifth birthday occurs on or before 31 July are eligible for enrolment for Kindergarten that year. By law, all children must be enrolled in school by their sixth birthday.

What if my child already attends a Catholic primary school in the Diocese?

A child who has completed primary education in a Catholic parish-based primary school will usually be offered continuity of enrolment in a Catholic secondary school. If no places exist at the chosen school, Catholic Education's Director System Performance will assist families to enrol in another Catholic secondary school in the Diocese.


