### St Patricks Day 2017

On Friday 17<sup>th</sup> March we will be celebrating St Patrick's Day. This year we have had to change from our previous venue at the Old Kings Oval due to access restrictions around the new developments taking place in Parramatta. In order to still provide the children with a special day we have made the following arrangements:



- 10:15am Liturgy in the school hall
- 11:45am Games in the park.
- 1:00pm Lunch at school.
- 2:00pm St Patrick's Jig in the playground (time permitting).

Families can join us for the Liturgy and afterwards head down to the park adjacent to the Old King's School where you can meet up with your children and join in the games or sit and watch. This is an opportunity for the children to have some well-deserved play time on real GRASS.

At around 12.45pm the students will start returning to school to pick up their pre-ordered lunch or eat their own. Parents may join the children back at school and after lunch the children can purchase the usual Friday ice blocks.

Once this is done the children will be returning to class with their teachers and prepare for the St Patrick's Jig (an impromptu Irish dance of sorts).

The children may wear green mufti for the day but must wear joggers and bring their school hat for safety reasons in the park. A water bottle should also be available to take to the park.

Children can bring extra props to wear for the afternoon jig and will be free to go home once all the festivities are completed.

We look forward to seeing as many of you on the day for either part of the day or all the celebrations starting with the liturgy at 10.15am.



### AFTER SCHOOL PICK UP


#### Dear Parents

We know that it can sometimes be difficult to determine whether your child is too sick to attend school. This chart reminds parents of the advisable periods of time children should be away from school during and after an illness. When your child is sent to school unwell it is impossible for them to focus on their learning. 


#### School Photos -16th March 2017
