Dear Parents,

Over the last few weeks the children from Kindergarten to Year 5 had the opportunity to vote for the Student Representative Council members (SRC) for their class, for Semester 2.

The Department of Education NSW publishes the following definition:

Many primary schools operate Student Representative Councils (SRCs). An SRC is a group of student in a school elected by their fellow students to represent all students in the school and who organise ways for students to participate in school life. SRCs work democratically to represent the student body in school decision-making. Students work together with help from a staff member to improve school life and contribute to students' ideas.

For most children being nominated by even one other child, is a big achievement, and to make it to the final few gives them incentive to continue to be kind and thoughtful of others. The nomination and selection of SRCs is purely the children's vote and is a way for children to have 'a voice' in their school. They decide as to whom they wish to represent their class and no adult makes any contribution to this process besides the organisation and counting of votes. It is wonderful to see how keen children are in recognising the gifts of others and in encouraging leadership in their class mates.

Student Voice is very important at St Patrick's Parramatta and we are continuing to work towards more student involvement as the years progress. Some of the principles guiding our work in this area include:

A belief that

- All children have a right to have a voice
- Children can learn to work together to improve school life and contribute student ideas
- All children can develop their individual capacity to lead and influence others in a responsible manner.
- Leadership is about service to the community
- Children can learn to make a positive difference in their community but there is a difference between popularity and effective leadership.
- A good student leadership program begins in Kindergarten

For your information the next group of SRC representatives will commence their roles at the beginning of Term 3 and their badges will be presented at the assembly on Friday 21st July, 2.00pm. Julie Owens (MP) has accepted our invitation to present the badges to these children. Our current SRC representatives will receive a thank you certificate for the service they have provided to our student community. The Semester 2 Colour Captains will also receive their badges.

Finally I would like to thank each and everyone of you for your support and commitment to the education of your children. I would also like to thank the staff for their dedication and hard work and wish you all a very restful holiday break.

OOSH BUS PICK UP

Dear Parents,

We ask for your cooperation when parking in the Villiers Street 5min pick up zone. This space is used by the OOSH bus that services over 44 children at the school. As you can imagine finding a place to park a bus is challenging at the best of times in our area and the bus driver depends on this space to ensure that our children are picked up safely. I understand the complications of parking around the school is difficult however the system appears to be working very well. Can I encourage all parents to use the drive through, follow road and parking rules, park a little further away and walk, be mindful of the after school bus and refrain from dropping off and having to reverse at the Ross Street driveway. Thanking you as always in assisting us to work together to ensuring all children's safety.

SAFETY ALERT - NEW ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL ARRANGEMENTS

Late last week we received a safety alert from our head office. The Police had advised us that there has been a higher than usual number of 'stranger danger' alerts recently, involving young children; in particularly one CEDP COSCH. Whilst there was no specific reference to the Parramatta area we feel it is best to adjust our arrival and dismissal arrangements slightly to add more security.

In response to this alert we will be keeping the Villier's Street gate locked in the morning and afternoon and only open the Ross Street entrance. In this way we can add extra security and are better placed to monitor who enters and leaves the school grounds. We understand that this will cause some inconvenience as parents and students will have to walk further.

We will review how this procedure goes and make a decision for future dismissals and drop offs. We will keep you informed if any new information comes to light. If you wish to give any feedback on this topic please use the school email or skoolbag app.

INFANTS FUN DAY




MATHS VISIT BY CEDP

Last week our Stage 2 teachers and students were visited by the CEDP leaders in Mathematics Education . This included Dr Ann Downton from Monash University who works in partnership with the Parramatta Diocese on an educational research project focusing on 'Multiplicative Thinking'.

All teachers at St Patrick's are participating in this professional learning course and on Wednesday these visitors worked alongside our Year 3 and 4 teachers as they challenged their students with a range of maths problems. Many comments such as "That's hard thinking', 'I noticed that you solved that problem in more than 2 ways", "I can see how you have recorded your reasoning" and "You have used an efficient strategy" were heard from these leaders as they spoke with our students. All who were involved with the day commented on the improvement of Stage 2 students in their development of multiplicative thinking.

Many thanks to Tammy Roosen our Maths Teaching Educator, our dedicated Stage 2 staff and of course our wonderful Year 3 and 4 students for ensuring this visit was such a mathematical success.


