Dear Parents

At the end of the term you will be receiving your child's mid-year report. There will also be an opportunity for you to meet with your child(rens) class teacher for up to 15 mins to see how they are travelling in their learning journey. Some grades will ask the children to come to the interview to be a part of the discussion around the learning and maybe to set goals for the next semester. You will be informed by letter if the children are required at the meeting. Meetings will be booked online and these will be available soon.

For those who are new to school reports, reports follow the A - E common grade scale for the 7 Key Learning Areas for Grades 1 to 6. The scale describes; The depth of **knowledge and understanding** and the **range of skills** that students working at that standard typically show. In line with the National Curriculum the strands within the subject are not reported separately. Knowledge and skills are seen as fully integrated eg, a student uses the skills of talking/listening, reading and writing in composing and responding to text within the English Curriculum. Computer skills and the use of the Library are also not seen as separate from the key areas of learning but rather integral tools with associated skills within each of them.

Other features of the report include;

- a report on effort
- information about the distribution of grades across the year that is how many students achieved A, B, C etc
- comments have been included for the three key areas of Religious Education, English and Mathematics
- a grading for Personal and Social Behaviours and Learning Habits
- a general comment.

In keeping with Government guidelines, Kindergarten reports do not use an A – E common grade scale as they are still emerging as learners. There are however three brief descriptors; Working Towards, Working At and Working Beyond for each Key Learning Area.

A record of absences and partial absences is given at the end of the report. It is worthy of note that significant absences and/or partial absences can have a significant impact on a child's learning and thus the report results.

In next week's newsletter I will be writing about how children are assessed and the changes to assessment in the contemporary educational arena. This includes the use of daily work samples to replace student portfolios which are now outdated and often restricts the learning/teaching process.

CHILD PROTECTION

Dear Parents

On some occasions your child may come home or speak to you on the playground regarding an incident that may have occurred between them and another child(ren). This is not unusual in a school of 412 children as many boys and girls are still learning the skills of negotiation, conflict resolution, compromise, effective communication and emotional regulation. If this happens and you feel that this is beyond the capacity of your child to manage or is of a nature that needs to be referred to the school, please contact your child's classroom teacher, Mrs Benkovich or myself. **Under no circumstances is it appropriate or acceptable for you to approach a child, other than your own, to inquire about what happened - even in a manner you feel is non threatening.** Adults can be unintentionally threatening to a little boy or girl of primary school age and children can become frightened or nervous. Child Protection legislation in a school is very strict regarding these issues. I am sure that no parents would wish another parent or member of another family to approach their child(ren). The school is committed to ensuring that all matters reported are followed up within a reasonable period of time and feedback communicated. Thanking you for your cooperation in this very important safety matter.

RECENT CHANGES TO EXTENDED LEAVE (APPLICATIONS NEEDED FOR 5 DAYS OR MORE)

The Catholic Education Office have made recent changes to the application for extended leave from 10 days or more to **5 days or more**.

- Parents or carers may approach the school to seek permission for extended leave during the school term. Extended leave is now considered to be 5 or more days.
- Parents/Carers must complete and submit the Application for Extended Leave **prior** to commencing leave OR apply for extended leave in writing to the principal directly.
- Please note that if the child does not return to school on the specified date in the application the school must be notified. If the family is not contactable the Department of Education and Training must be informed.
- On most occasions it is in the child's best interest for all holidays to be scheduled in gazetted holiday times.

In the list below, there are 12 items. You have to use these items to create something and give it a marketable name. A minimum of 5 items must be used. You do not have to use the entire quantity. You can use all 12 items if you choose. You have 25 words or less to explain the purpose of your 'creation' and state its name. You must submit a photograph of the creation along with the entry form.

You will be judged on the 'originality' of your creation, its name and its purpose.

Items that can be used:

- Up to 10 toothpicks
- 2 pipe cleaners
- 1 to 6 drinking straws
- 1 ping pong ball
- 50cms of foil (standard width)
- 50cms string
- 1 to 6 paper clips
- 1 small recycled plastic drink bottle
- 1 to 4 paper plates
- 50cms crepe paper (standard width)
- Up to 3 sheets of A4 paper`
- 1 rubber band

Not included in the list but may be used in small quantities: glue, sticky or masking tape. Scissors can also be used.

The creation must be made at home. You have a choice to work with a partner or to work individually. Both Infants and Primary will be allowed to participate and there will 3 finalists from Infants and 3 finalists from Primary. The Creation is due in Week 7 of this term and finalists must bring their creation in on Week 9 of this term. Please fill in the entry form below and return it to the school office if you would like to participate.
