Dear Parents.

Last Tuesday week, 1st August, the school underwent the process of Peer Review. All schools in the Diocese of Parramatta undertake Peer Review every year. The school was informed last month of the date and was later informed of the key sample areas to be audited. This year, the curriculum documents the school needed to present were, Mathematics and Human Society and its Environment. The specific stage level this year was Stage 3 - Years 5 and 6. By way of further explanation:

**Peer Review** is a key part of the School Compliance audit process which allows all schools to view, assess and provide critical feedback on the curriculum presented by the school being reviewed.

This model of **Peer Review** has been approved by **the NSW Education Standards Authority ( NESA )** in 2014 for the registration period (2015-2019) and is unique to Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) in the current form and structure of implementation.

Other areas audited during this period included; Attendance, timetables—Kindergarten to Year 6, Student Management and Anti-Bullying policies and procedures, School Reporting and Complaints and Grievances management.

The overall results of this compliance audit were extremely positive, with only a small amendment needed in two of the timetables.

Some of the feedback comments given were;

- The school has clearly stated the weeks and topics to go with the content. History and geography scope and sequence is highlighted correctly and done according to the guidelines. clear, organised and easy to follow.
- Programs clearly show the resources used, relevant outcomes, and are correctly dated and initialed. There were detailed programs that address differentiation, assessments, learning outcomes and general capabilities.
- Programs were specific. Differentiation is shown. Outcomes are met. Clear, consistent annotations were evident from each of the teachers. Daily activities were well organised. The program was easy to follow allowing others to see the progression within the teaching and learning sequences.
- There was good tracking of student achievement with a mark book showing achievement. There was systematic and consistent record keeping that reflects an overview of the process. There was a very thorough analysis of student work samples matched with use of rubrics and success criteria.

Congratulations is extended to the teachers who presented on the day; Ms Kelly, Mrs Standring, Mrs Carroll, Mrs Rayess, Mrs Barclay and Mrs Benkovich.



#### **ATTENDANCE LETTERS (< 90% attendance)**

#### **Dear Parents**

As you are aware, every day of attendance at school adds to your child's chances of success and achievement from Kindergarten and through to high school. Parents play a key role in making sure their child attends school every day. As previously explained the school, through our system, Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP), is well equipped to track children's attendance and this data enables the school to alert parents to their child's attendance level. This information can sometimes be surprising to parents who may not realise that the attendance of their child is getting to an undesirable level. Even the odd day here and there eg a total of 10 days a term, is equal to a day a week. We fully understand that some absences are unavoidable due to health problems or other circumstances however we also know that when students miss too much school, no matter the reason, it can cause them to fall behind academically.

In an effort to keep parents informed of their child's attendance data, a letter will be sent home when a child's attendance percentage falls below 90%. This will include children whose absence is due to illness or leave for example. This information is for your attention as a way to assist you to monitor attendance levels. The only exceptions to this rule will be if there has been significant consultation with the school regarding attendance, be it health matters or other circumstances and in these circumstances other support or accommodations have been implemented.

In this way not only is the school keeping open communication with families but the school s fulfilling the process of tracking attendance in accordance with CEDP policies. If you have any questions regarding attendance please do not hesitate to contact me.

#### **SCHOOL UNIFORM - APPEAL FOR ASSISTANCE**

#### **Dear Parents**

In an effort to keep up the school's good reputation regarding school uniform, can I please ask you to be vigilant about the way the boys and girls wear their ties. I have noticed for quite a while now that many boys are looking quite dishevelled with their ties either undone and hanging loose or not worn. Some girls are wearing ties where the elastic has become loose, hanging down. Ties for both boys and girls need to be secured as close to the collar as possible. It is very important that children follow the uniform code; an area that is key to the Student Charter. This charter reminds children that they have a RIGHT to be proud of their school and thus they have the RESPONSIBILITY to wear their uniform with pride. Mr Joe Arida from Oz Fashions confirmed that while the tie says 'Dry Clean Only' ties may be washed but need to placed in a laundry bag, to prevent tangling and possible ripping. He also confirmed that he is more than happy to assist parents if the tie is damaged for some reason eg if the stitching has come undone. Please contact Oz Fashions if this is the case. The maintenance of the standard of school uniform is best achieved if it is a team effort; student, school and family. We ask your assistance in this matter.


You may like to reflect upon the Scripture Verse I am referring to;
