Dear Parents

Last week, the children in Years 3 and 5 received their National Assessment Program –Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) results for 2017. Children sat for these assessments earlier in the year, from Tuesday, the 9th of May to Thursday the 11th May and elements of learning tested included: aspects of literacy such as; reading, spelling, grammar and punctuation and writing, as well as numeracy. Whilst we understand that these results are only indicators or how the students performed on the one day, it is always satisfying for the school to get very good results; and this year was no exception. The online package that comes to schools to support the NAPLAN data is extensive and the teachers and teacher leaders are still analyzing where the school made significant gains and areas for further development. Some of the analysis so far is as follows:

YEAR 3

- 59 students sat for NAPLAN 2017
- No children were withdrawn or absent

• The percentage of students below national minimum standards = (0%) in all areas except Grammar and Punctuation (3%)

• School average in all areas is above the National and CEDP average. The average score for Reading was mid Band 5, Writing - lower Band 5, Spelling - mid band 5, Grammar and Punctuation -high Band 5 and Numeracy-lower Band 5 (Bands for Year 3 are bands 1-6)

• The percentage of students in the top two bands ie Bands 5 and 6 were above the state in Reading, Writing and Numeracy, Grammar & Punctuation, Reading and Spelling

- An area for focused further improvement is in the area of Writing
- Trend data is showing that the scores are well above that of the state in all areas.

<u>YEAR 5</u>

- 62 students sat for NAPLAN 2017
- No children were withdrawn or absent

• The percentage of students below national minimum standards = (2%) in Writing and Grammar & Punctuation and (0%) in all other areas

• School average in all areas is above the National and CEDP average. The average score for Reading was lower Band 7, Writing - mid Band 6, Spelling - lower band 7, Grammar and Punctuation - Lower Band 7 and Numeracy- upper Band 6 (Bands for Year 5 are 3-8)

• The percentage of students in the top two bands ie Bands 5 and 6 was above the state in Reading, Writing and Numeracy.

- Areas of particular strength this year were Reading, Spelling and Grammar and Punctuation
- An area for focused further improvement is in the area of Writing
- Trend data is showing that the scores are above that of the state in all areas.
- Many students showed significant growth in all areas from Years 3 to 5 especially in the area of Numeracy where 83.6% reached expected growth.
- A topic for further consideration is to investigate why some students reach or excel beyond the expected growth and why some do not.

Teachers will continue to use the NAPLAN results to assist them to; better understand the learning needs of individual students in their class, to observe patterns and trends in specific question items and to take further action to target specific literacy and numeracy skills.

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When viewing these results, as a school or as a family, is important to remember that children will be sitting a number of formal assessments throughout their school lives and that many of the skills they possess are not always assessed in these types of tests.

Children who have artistic or sporting ability, problem solvers and those possessing interpersonal skills, those able to synthesize information and creative thinkers, for example, are not able to demonstrate their talent in Literacy and Numeracy assessments of this kind. The skills of acting or dancing are not tested and the ability to be flexible or to use curiosity to further develop learning are not considered in these results. Children who have the ability to 'bounce back' from set backs are not acknowledged either. Whilst we encourage our students to do their very best on the day of the tests we are aware that results can vary and a student who may in fact be quite a good writer, for example, may not produce their best piece of writing on that particular day. My message to all students is always, 'You are not your report or your results, you are so much more!" Focussing on learning leads to an increase in performance, focussing on performance leads to a fixed mindset and anxiety. A thought worth pondering.

STAFF DEVELOPMENT DAY

Last Monday the staff were involved in a wonderful Professional Development Day on Religious Education. The day was facilitated by Religious Education Coordinator, Leanda Standring, Learning Leader - Mission, Mr Anthony Gordon and the Dean of the Cathedral, Father Bob Bossini.

We commenced the day with a workshop on Eucharist and Father led us through an in depth understanding of the Mass. This was then followed by Mass in which we kept you all in our prayers. The body of the day was focussed on 'unpacking' scripture. The term 'unpacking' is a process of taking an indepth look at a piece of scripture and reflecting on the Literal, Spiritual and Application senses. When we read the scriptures we are encouraged to use these senses to develop a deeper understanding of the message and faithful mystery of what lies within them.

We finished the day by working in small groups to create a symbolic artefact showing our new learning and connecting the Sacrament of Eucharist to the miracle recorded in the Scripture passage - 'Jesus Feeds the Five Thousand'. The results truly reflected the deep learning and faith of our teachers.


MERCY DAY INCURSION
