There are many ways parents can encourage literacy and numeracy at home. Whilst the approach to numeracy in the school is very much 'hands on', focused on authentic discovery and reflective on mathematical thinking and 'hard thinking', in nature compared to the more procedural focus of these activities, they can still provide some ideas on key concepts.


It is hoped the students enjoy attending the incursion and develop a deepened understanding of the life and influence of an incredible Australian.










Woolworths Earn & Learn 2017

If your child catches the bus it would be appreciated if you could go through the following guidelines with them to ensure everyone's safety.



We're seeking your support and assistance as a *Person Conducting a Business or Undertaking* (PCBU) to help us educate our younger passengers with the following simple messages:

- · Make every effort to Show Travel Pass and tap on and off using Opal Card when using our services
- Keep bags and other items clear of the aisle
- Remain in your seat do not move around the bus unnecessarily
- If standing, students should remain behind the front passenger seat and hold on at all times
- Students should not allow any part of their body to protrude out of the bus at any time
- Avoid distracting the driver except in the case of emergency
- Cross roads safely and use crossings/traffic lights where available
- Obey reasonable directions from the driver (e.g. where to sit or to remain in the bus)
- Stand away from the roadside until the bus comes to a complete stop
- Do not swing on bars or drop handles
- Fighting, spitting, abusive language, feet on seats, throwing things in or from the bus is not permitted
- Offer seats to adults including people with a disability, elderly or expectant mothers
- Allow other passengers to leave the bus before stepping onto the bus in a single line
- Avoid standing on the road in school bus bays and passenger waiting areas
