Dear Parents

Today is All Soul's Day and is a day where we are encouraged to think of and pray for our dearly departed. On this day people all around the world take time to attend mass and cemeteries to spend time with members of their family who have passed on. Having lost both my father and my mother it is fair to say that there is not a single day that goes past where I do not think of both of these amazingly special people. I imagine there are many of you who know exactly what I am speaking about and although it has been many years now since their passing when I hear their favourite song or someone mentions their name I am reminded about all they have contributed to the lives of my family and how much we miss them.

I think it is when you lose someone close and dear to you that you realize how special our Catholic faith is. Our church traditions are such that they assist people through their grief and the signs and symbolic actions within the requiem mass guide and lead us to a sense of hope in our sadness. The thought that they are still with us in heaven, someone we can pray to and pray for, can only leave us with much joy and love. Pope Francis shares some very welcoming thoughts this All Soul's Day.

I would like to share with you some of his reflections.

- All Souls feast is a hopeful reminder of the resurrection'
- 'Visiting a cemetery on the feast of All Souls can evoke feelings of loss and sadness, but for Christians marking the feast, it also is an affirmation of hope in the resurrection'
- 'We are walking the path that he walked, and he brings us through the door that he himself opened. With his cross, he opened the door of hope. He opened the door so that we can enter into where we will contemplate God.'
- 'Although visiting the tombs of loved ones who have passed away and realizing that death will come for each person can bring feelings of sadness, that the act of bringing flowers to a cemetery is also a sign of joyful hope in the afterlife.'
- The feast of All Souls takes on a "dual meaning" where "sadness is mixed with hope. We return home today with this dual memory: the memory of the past, of our loved ones who have gone and the memory of the future, the path we will go on with the certainty and with the assurance that came from Jesus' lips: 'I will raise him up on the last day,'

Beautiful words! Beautiful thoughts!

Today let us all think and pray for all those people who are dear to us and to our community at St Patrick's Parramatta and who are no longer with us. I invite you and your family to prayer the following prayer.

NOTIFICATION REGARDING GATE CLOSURE IN 2018

To ensure full compliance with the school's timetable hours (8.50am to 3.00pm) please be aware that as from Term 1, 2018 the main gate will be locked at the official gazetted school start time, that is at 8.50am. This will mean that any child who arrives after 8.50am will require an adult to sign them in and this will be recorded as a partial absence. We are no longer able to continue to give children the 10mins grace period. It is hoped that giving families this early notification will assist parents whose children are currently arriving late to school ie after 8.50am. It is our recommendation that parents and children begin working on strategies now, to try to arrive by the starting time. Below are some suggestions to help improve this punctuality.

- 1. Prepare as much as you can the night before
- 2. Identify and overcome distractions
- 3. Make your morning routine visual
- 4. Delegate some responsibility
- 5. Make yourself scarce
- 6. Be willing to take your child to school even if they aren't fully ready

Bus Safety Week 6 -12 November 2017

- NSW has one of the largest metropolitan bus fleets in Australia.
- Every day in NSW, hundreds of thousands of school children, workers and tourists use buses to get around and travel all or part of their journey to school and work or to explore our state.
- In the five years to 2016, 20 people lost their lives in bus-related crashes, while 1,335 people were injured across the Sydney-Newcastle-Wollongong area. Of these 20 fatalities, 12 were pedestrians, 4 were drivers of other vehicles, 2 were cyclists, 1 was the passenger of another vehicle, and 1 was a motorcyclist.
- Crashes involving buses often result in more severe outcomes to other road users due to their size and mass, and because due to their size and weight, they take more time to stop.

2018 Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials - Students with Representative Experience or Above Average Ability

Any Primary students enrolled in Year 5 and 6 for 2018 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term Four in 2017 and Term One in 2018. In some sports students in Year 4 MAY nominate.

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who <u>display an above average ability and/or have</u> representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is strongly recommended that <u>only children</u> of a representative standard in Years 5 & 6 in 2018 be invited to attend.

Parramatta Diocesan trials will be held in the following sports:

*AFL (boys), Basketball (B&G), Cricket (B&G), Diving (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Football (B&G), Golf (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Netball (girls), Rugby League (11yrs & Opens), Rugby Union (boys), Softball (B&G), Tennis (B&G), & Touch(B&G).

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au

This online form is an <u>EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY</u> for the 2018 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. Parents may complete this form to attend a selection trial. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

Please note that your online registration is an <u>EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY and MUST be approved by the child's school.</u> In order for the child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of the school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. All fields and especially "Representative Experience" MUST be completed.

Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

Currently only the Summer Sports of BASKETBALL & TENNIS are open and registrations close on Friday 27th October as these trials will be held in November 2017.

All other sport registrations will open in November for 2018 trials.


