Dear Parents

Last week the school held Parent Information sessions for Yr 1 to Yr 6 and I would like to thank all those parents who were able to attend. It was so good to see you all there and we appreciate the many interesting questions and positive feedback about your children's learning that you gave us. As I said on the various nights, for those of you who could attend, it speaks volumes about how you value education and demonstrates to them your interest in what your children are doing at school. Of course I do understand that sometimes the family circumstances and or commitments on the scheduled evenings prevent you from attending. If this was the case we will attach a copy of the handouts or power point for your convenience, over the next few weeks.

Over the course of the evenings the topic of reading comprehension, particularly children's difficulty with comprehension was discussed. The process of reading involves a very complex set of skills and comprehension is key to the act of reading. If comprehension, ie understanding, is not present the reader is not reading. There are many aspects to discuss when speaking about learning to read however one element which is often forgotten is the skill of Visualization and Verbalization. Educationalist Nanci Bell maintains that "The brain uses imagery to comprehend and interpret oral and written language." She also says that if this skill is weak, "this weakness often undermines the reading process...It is weakness, based in the sensory system, in creating an imaged gestalt." This idea is supported by a quote from Albert Einstein who is known to have said that "If I can't picture it, I can't understand it".

In my experience children who 'hate' reading or who find reading difficult often tell me that they do not visualize, they cannot visualize; they do not 'paint pictures in their mind' as they are reading or create 'movies in their head'. Adults who hate reading have also expressed this realization. Sometimes these people, including children, also have difficulty with critical, logical, abstract thinking and problem solving, written language comprehension, oral language comprehension, following directions, expressing language orally, expressing language in writing, grasping humor, interpreting social situations, cause and effect, attention and focus, mental mapping. The interesting fact is that visualizing and then talking about what is being visualized can be taught. Here are some easy tips to try with your child. These strategies are for readers of **all** ages who may be having difficulty reading:

- **Picture Imaging** Ask your child to describe a simple picture that you have shown them. Ask him or her questions about; what they are seeing, the Size, Color, Number, Shape, Place, Movement, Mood, Background, Perspective, Time and Sound. They can look at the picture as you ask them questions however it is best that you do not see the picture so as to give them a reason for answering like a barrier game.
- **Word Imaging** Do the same for simple nouns but this time use words; written or said eg cat, dog, tower, circus, skyscraper, vehicle etc
- **Sentence Imaging** Do the same for simple sentences
- Story Imaging Do the same for simple stories. Use picture books and play a game by covering the pictures. Ask children to describe what the picture may look like, then reveal the picture and compare the mind image to that of the illustrators. (Please note, that beginning readers need to use the pictures to assist them when reading. This is to be encouraged until they no longer need the pictures to read. Do not cover the pictures when the children are reading. Only cover the pictures when encouraging the skill of visualization)
- Visualization by drawing pictures. Talk about details of the drawing and help the child to add detail to the picture.

PEDICULOSIS - HEAD LICE

To avoid incidences of head lice in the school we ask that you regularly check your child's hair, taking particular care in children from K—2. Various treatments are available from the Chemist. Covering the hair with a thick layer of conditioner and leaving for approximately 5 minutes then combing out the lice can also be effective. Wash hair after combing.


This State Election – vote 1 for Catholic education

DID YOU KNOW? The Federal Government contributes 57.5% of the cost of educating a child in a NSW Catholic school, and the NSW Government contributes 19.7%. The remaining 22.8% comes from parents and the parish community through school fees and private fundraising. This is why funding support from Federal and State Governments must keep pace with rising education costs - to maintain education quality and to ensure a Catholic education remains affordable for all families.

WHAT'S NEW AT ST PATRICK'S

Over the next five weeks we will be communicating and implementing a new Whole School student Management Program.

The initial stage of this program will focus on the Student Reward Section and this will be followed by the Framework for Consequences Section. Much work has been and will continue to be done with the children in unpacking these systems, what they include and what they will look like in our school. There will also be a Parent Meeting to further communicate what the Framework for Consequences Section entails.



FIRST STAGE - WHOLE SCHOOL STUDENT MANAGEMENT REWARD SYSTEM

Last year the teachers at St Patrick's explored our school's heritage and its connection to Mercy Traditions and Values. As a staff, we researched the life of Catherine McAuley, who she was, what she stood for and how we could incorporate the values she displayed in her life, into our school community.

We developed three Mascots; Ricky Respect, who promotes fairness and encourages us to be welcoming. Coolio Compassion who endorses care and thoughtfulness and Rocky Resilience, who advocates to students to be determined and positive. These Mascots were introduced to our students and can be seen all around our school. Children also met the Super Shamrock Reward Cards.

Children will start to receive these Reward Cards as of next week. They will be awarded to students, when teachers see the desirable behaviours our Mascots promote being modelled. When a grade collects enough of these Super Shamrocks, special rewards will be given. The rewards will be dependent on what the children and teachers in each grade decide.

As parents and teachers we are extremely important role models and it would be great for the children to see us all exhibiting these core values.

Kindergarten Afternoon Pick-up

If you are personally picking up your child from the school at 3.00pm, children can be collected from the Amphitheatre, where they will be seated and waiting with the teacher on duty. If your child has not been collected from the Amphitheatre by 3.15pm, they will return to their classroom where they can be collected.

If you are using our car drive-thru service, your child's name will be called and they will promptly walk down to the car pick-up gate. Where they will be assisted into their car.

Any children remaining after 3.30pm can be collected from the school Office.

ENROLMENTS FOR 2016 KINDERGARTEN ARE NOW OPEN

Enrolment packs for Kindergarten 2016 are available from the school between the hours of 9am -3pm Monday to Friday.

When you return the enrolment you will need to bring your child's original Birth Certificate, Baptismal Certificate, Passports (parent's and child's if born overseas), Immunization Certificates and proof of address (council rates, drivers licence). We will photo copy these and return them to you at this time.

Enrolment forms are required to be returned by 31st March 2015.

CHANGES TO ENROMENT CRITERIA

The Catholic Education Diocese Office has made changes to the enrolment criteria for all children applying for places in a Catholic school.

ENROLMENT CRITERIA

Who can enrol in a Catholic school?

Children whose fifth birthday occurs on or before 31 July are eligible for enrolment for Kindergarten that year. By law, all children must be enrolled in school by their sixth birthday.

A new Enrolment Policy for Parramatta Diocesan Catholic schools has been introduced which offers Catholic families greater choice by allowing them to apply for enrolment at a Catholic school anywhere in the Diocese. Where places are limited, priority will be given in order to:

- · Catholic children who live in the local parish
- · Catholic children from other parishes
- Children of families who actively participate in the life of the school and local parish community (e.g. siblings)
- · Orthodox children
- · Children from other Christian faiths
- · Children of non-Christian faith

Catholic schools have a strong religious dimension and people of other faiths who wish to enrol in Catholic schools should be willing to participate in the religious activities of the school. Check with the principal of the school you are applying to.

Siblings

Siblings of children already enrolled in the school are considered by the same criteria above. However, within each of these categories, a sibling of a child already enrolled will have preference over an applicant who does not have a sibling enrolled in the school.

What if my child already attends a Catholic primary school in the Diocese?

A child who has completed primary education in a Catholic parish-based primary school will usually be offered continuity of enrolment in a Catholic secondary school. If no places exist at the chosen school, Catholic Education's Director System Performance will assist families to enrol in another Catholic secondary school in the Diocese.

Attention Volunteers: Please note that both requirements below need to be completed.

Child Protection Module For Volunteers

Parents and other family members are unable to assist if this module is not completed and submitted. Parents only need to complete this module once every two years. Looking forward to welcoming you as volunteers as you share you gifts with our school community.

It is a system requirement that child protection training be completed by all volunteers commencing work in our school and a briefing every second year for existing volunteers.

An online training module for use by volunteers is available. To use the module:

- 1. Open the module by clicking the **Start** link below.
- 2. Read through the presentation.
- 3. Complete and submit quiz questions. This will take approximately 45 minutes.
- 4. After successful completion of the module, fill out the form by typing your name, email address, contact number, contact address and the school you intend to volunteer at.

Water


Tap water makes the best drink!
