In all honesty it feels that I have been with you for 3 whole terms, not just weeks. I think what has contributed to this feeling of familiarity is the extraordinary quality of hospitality and friendliness I have experienced at the school. Thank you! This is particularly visible in the students who have embraced their new teachers and myself with such enthusiasm and warmth, qualities obviously inherited from you, their family.

A huge thank you to all the visitors who came to our Catholic Schools Week (CSW) activities; liturgy, open day, art exhibition and playground picnic lunch. It was so good to see you all there and I know the children loved to witness you showing such interest in them and their education. I would like to particularly thank our Religious Education Coordinator Mrs Jude Kerr and her CSW Committee for organizing all these events.

On Monday 17<sup>th</sup>, March we will celebrate the feast day of our school's Patron Saint, St Patrick. He is such an interesting man to learn about and his association with the Irish people combined with the enormous contribution the Irish convicts and settlers had on the establishment of the first colony and the importance Parramatta played in the success of this early settlement makes him particularly significant to us.

The Saint Patrick's Breastplate or Lorica is often associated with St Patrick's ministry in the 5<sup>th</sup> Century and is a Christian hymn incorporating old Irish Lyrics. There is one verse which is particularly well known and it reminds us of the presence of Christ in every aspect of our existence. As we read this prayer and celebrate St Patrick's Day together let us remember to always rise to the challenge of being Christ-like people with and for each other and in this regard continue to demonstrate the qualities we wish our children to aspire to.

#### Art Exhibition


