### Dear Parents

As we head toward the last few weeks of Term 1 it is timely for us to review with our children their learning journey so far. In an earlier newsletter I wrote about the concept of being the 'driver or the passenger' of the learning. I wonder how our children have fared in their learning vehicle?

As I implied in this article sometimes children get the idea that their learning and behaviour is the responsibility of someone other than themselves. For example, when questioned by the teacher about homework, children can take to shifting the responsibility of this task to their parents; complaints such as "mum or dad forgot to put it in my bag" are quite common. They are also tempted to blame their peers and in these cases responding with "I couldn't finish my work because he or she was disturbing me."

Of course, it is not only children who are guilty of shifting responsibility; we can all do it. Statements such as "other people were doing it too so that's why I did it" or "everyone does it!" are classic examples of excuses for failing to accept responsibility for our own actions. A wise colleague once compared the responsibility for learning, to trying to lose weight. A person may have access to a skilled dietician, a gym membership and books full of healthy recipes but until that person realises that they have to take responsibility for implementing their weight loss program, not a kilo will be lost. Likewise, once children realise that they have a responsibility to contribute to their own learning and behaviour, great results can be achieved!

Reflective Questions that may be helpful to encourage your children to think about their learning include:

What did I learn this term? How do I learn best? What questions do I have about my learning? What can I do with this learning? Where do I go now with this learning" In what new contexts can my learning be applied?

It is well worth remembering that some of our most significant learning experiences can take place in the context of errors and mistakes. Learning what to never do again is as valuable as learning what to do. Keeping this in mind helps us to try to value all life experiences as learning opportunities

#### Year 5 Excursion: The Blue Mountains Botanic Gardens Mt Tomah

On Friday the 14<sup>th</sup> of March Year 5 teachers, students and parent helpers went on an excursion to Mt Tomah in the Blue Mountains Botanic Gardens. We travelled for about an hour by bus and on the way saw some beautiful green farms with lots of trees, fruits and even horses and cows. When we arrived we were amazed at the wonderful mountains, valleys and forest areas that we could see from high up on Mt Tomah. We even saw steam evaporating from the rivers below. Our guides then took us for a walk through the Mt Tomah gardens and rainforest. We got to see and explore different plant species and they told us about the history of the Mt Tomah Botanic Gardens and how they came to be. We saw many beautiful and interesting flora and learnt many new facts such as what basalt looks like and names of special trees such as Eucalyptus Fastigata and Wollemia Nobilis and how they got their names. All of the students enjoyed taking photos as we walked along. We then got to explore the herb and flower gardens. The fresh herbs smelt delicious. After our tour we got to sit in the garden and eat our lunch while listening to the beautiful sounds of the birds and looking out over the forest from the top lookout. - Activity Hub lego, chess, computers etc where children who find the playground challenging/overwhelming can go for some quiet time with a friend.


## St Patrick's Parramatta Principal's Report 25/03/2014

#### **Bernadette Fabri**

- Special welcome to the school year for 2014. Welcome to all our new families and staff. I am particularly enjoying being here with you all. You are such passionate community and it is such a pleasure to be here at St Patrick's Parramatta. This year we welcome Ms Sara Toman(Yr2) and Ms Nicole Dunseath(Yr2), Mr David Younis (PE),Mrs Trudy Ricketts (School Counsellor Wednesday), and Mrs Jaunita Gray (Mon) and Mrs Belinda Hamilton (Tues) in the office.
- Children have settled very well into their new classes and new class teachers. We are particularly happy with how quickly Kindergarten has settled in.
- A special thank you to the parents for their cooperation with regard to morning routine. Comments from teachers indicate that they feel that children are more settled entering in class and I feel satisfied that the safety aspect of the morning has been addressed.
- Teachers are very happy with how the children are progressing and they are well into their units of work.
- Assemblies have this year been changed to 2.20pm in the afternoon to allow teachers to optimize prime learning time in the morning.
- The school gathered for the Opening School Mass on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> February after which we had the commissioning of badges for our school leaders and the myself. Fr Chris D'Souza said that he was delighted with how beautifully the children sang. The primary children have commenced going to parish masses every Friday. After mass many parents gathered at the school hall for a lovely morning tea and we decided to invite the school leaders to attend. We are looking to make this an annual event.
- Some of the Year 6 children had the great experience of being part of the TV Program, Its Academic. The programs will be shown in November and the school will remind parents about these dates closer to the time.
- The Parent Information Nights were very well attended and the teachers at which the teachers were able to present some guidelines for the grade that they are teaching. We wish to reiterate that if at any time you wish to speak to your child's class teacher or me please ring and make an appointment. Communication is extremely important and we are more than happy to assist if we can.
- All staff have now commenced programming from the National Curriculum for English. We are continuing to get Professional Development support its implementation
- All children have now been tested using the Mathematical Assessment Instrument as part of the Extending Mathematical Understanding approach to teaching Mathematics. The National Curriculum for Maths will be implemented in 2015. This information has been used to inform the teaching program. Teachers are still receiving Professional Development in refining practice to improve learning outcomes in this very important Key Learning Area.
- Thank you to all the parent volunteers who have already completed the child protection module. We now have access to all the information regarding who has completed it and when. The school has now commenced a register of parent helpers for excursions so that we can see who has had a turn over the years.
- Congratulations to all the boys and girls who represented the school at the Cumberland Zone Swimming Carnival and to all those children who made it through to the Parramatta Diocesan Swimming Carnival. Special mention is made of Emile Saab 11yrsAge Champion and George Khoury 12yrs Boys Runner Up. Thank you to all the parents who assisted Mrs Fardell who has done an absolutely fabulous job in her role as Acting Coordinator 1.
- On Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> March many of the staff attended the Annual Diocesan Mass at St Patrick's Blacktown. Our young teachers were commissioned and so was I in a group of around 12 new principals in our Diocese. This year they had a parade of banners from all schools in the diocese and our representative was Yvette Roque.
- Our second hand uniform sale was very successful with thanks to a number of mothers who helped organise and sell the items. We are looking towards outsourcing the Uniform Shop and are currently gathering together information with regard to the procedures we need to follow through the Catholic Education Office. We hope to have this in place by 2015.
- Shrove Tuesday was a great success once again due to the assistance from the parent helpers. We have also been very fortunate to be able to use the Cathedral overflow thanks to the Dean of the Cathedral the Very Reverand Father John McSweeney. Father is still recovering from a slight stroke from earlier in the year. We thank him very much and hope that this is helpful. A permit will be available to indicate to office staff that your car has been authorized.
- Ash Wednesday was also another beautiful liturgy and the children behaved very well. A prayer liturgy was also held at school for the infants and their parents at which teachers distributed the ashes.

- We have had a number of excursions this term and one two more to go>Yr Three went to Featherdale farm to support their unit on Australian Fauna and Flora, Yr 4 went to Arabanoo, Yr 5 went to Mt Tomah and this Thursday Yr 2 will be going to Warragambah Dam. Our last excursion for the term will be Yr 6s excursion to Canberra. Yr One had an Incursion with a visit from the local Fire Brigade. This added very valuable learning opportunities for their unit on Community Helpers.
- May I encourage all parents to collect from the Cathedral 'the Faith in our Future' booklet which speaks of the Diocesan Five Year Plan; 'to grow in our faith' and ' to share our faith'.
- The Staff Development Days for the year have now been advertised in the newsletter. There will be one on the last day of this term, Friday, 11<sup>th</sup> April. The staff will be learning about the Mindset Theory (Dr Carol Dweck), will be continuing to work on developing a rich Literacy Block as part of the diocesan Focus 160 project and will be learning more about Classm8 and the use of Google Docs and how they can be used to improve learning outcomes for children.
- The staff have also had an opportunity to visit other schools in the diocese to gather ideas and to reflect on current practice. They have really enjoyed this aspect of their learning.
- Enrolments for 2015 are currently being taken and this period will finish Friday 31<sup>st</sup> May.
- On Monday 10<sup>th</sup> March the school held an open day as part of Catholic School's Week. A beautiful liturgy was held in the morning and an art exhibition.
- St Patrick's Day was a great success commencing with a beautiful liturgy and picnic at the park. Thank you to the St Patrick's Day committee.
- Thank you to all the parents who have already completed the Quality Catholic School's Survey organised by the Catholic Education Office through the company Insight. All schools in the Parramatta Diocese are part of this survey and all staff and this year all of Yrs 5 and 6 students and older are included. Parents are selected at random from the CEDP.
- I hope everyone is accessing the school newsletter. We are currently investigating a new app which will enable you to access information and alerts from the school in a much easier way. We will keep you posted.
