Dear Parents

It is hard to believe that we are half way through Term Two already. The children are well and truly into their units of work and have completed many activities to build their knowledge and skills about a variety of interesting topics.

On a recent visit to one of the classes we had a discussion on the terminology 'Learning Intent' and 'Success Criteria'. I represented learning as a winding road which at the summit had the learning intent. Another way this can be explained is the road to achieving a learning goal and is often associated with what we want to know, understand or do. Examples of a learning intent could be; to be able to write a recount, know how energy works or to understand how the internet can assist research. I explained to the children that along the road there are flags which indicate the success criteria. These indicators tell us how we are going in the achieving of the learning goal such as, if we are to write a recount we must be able to write an introduction, use time sequence words and sequence events accurately. You may have noticed that the teachers are using learning intents and success criteria for many of their lessons across the Key Learning Areas. These are displayed in the classroom and children are made aware of the goal during the lesson. The use of these tools helps the students to focus and assess if they are achieving success.

Another concept explored during my visit was the image that the road never ends, in other words learning never ceases even when we are older. Helping children to be life-long learners is a great attitude to develop. Looking at our learning heroes – people that we admire for their interest in learning is another strategy to encourage a good learning attitude. In his work in 'Teaching Values for Life' writer David Koutsoukis lists some key points to encourage children to become life-long learners. They are as follows;

Be positive about learning

Seek knowledge about self, others and the world around us

Recognize the value of knowledge

Have an enquiring mind – be curious

Determine how we learn best

Have an open mind

Be a critical thinker

Have a global perspective

Seek learning opportunities everywhere

Keep learning

Read every day

Read non fiction as well as fiction

Buy lots of books and start your own book collection at home (this can be digital as well)

Ask lots of questions

Look up answers to questions or solutions to problems on the internet

Find learning heroes

Read newspapers

Watch documentaries

Keep a learning journal - 'what I have learned today is'
