On the 19th September Bishop Anthony Fisher OP was appointed the 9th Archbishop of Sydney by his Holiness Pope Francis. Parishioners of St Patrick's Cathedral have a special relationship with Archbishop-Elect Anthony who regularly says mass at the Cathedral since becoming Bishop of Parramatta in 2010. On his Face book page Bishop Anthony thanked the people of the diocese and asked us to pray for him. Six of our senior students had the pleasure of going to the press conference held at the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta building, where they heard Archbishop-Elect Anthony speak of his vision for the people of Sydney and for Catholics around the world.
