CONGRATULATIONS MORAN PHOTOGRAPHIC PRIZE WINNERS

Dear Parents

On Tuesday the 24th March this year, a group of Year 5 students had the opportunity to be involved in a photographic workshop run by the Moran Arts Foundation. These 30 students spent the day with award winning photographer Louise Whelan. Ms Whelan, taught the students about the art of photography, particularly learning about the stories behind photographs and the impact and uses of this 'visual art'. They then learned some basics which included the importance of considering subject, background, composition, framing and light and were inspired by the many beautiful examples of photographs Ms Whelan shared with them. The morning was followed by two practical sessions which involved the students planning and taking their own photos using cameras and printing docks made available by; Ms Whelan, workshop organisers from the Moran Arts Foundation and the workshop sponsors. The children then chose some of their favourite shots which were printed for them to take home to share with family and friends. All the children also submitted six photos into the primary section of the Moran Contemporary Photographic Prize 2015 K – 6 section.

It is with enormous excitement and pride that I can announce to you that two of our students, Audrey Baysari and Nicole Romanos were chosen as finalists, each for one of their photos. Interestingly Audrey's photo depicted Nicole in midair – a great shot, and Nicole's photo was a black and white depiction of our school, taken from a second story balcony – a real 'moment in time' as described by one of our teachers. The Moran Contemporary Photographic Prize is a national competition and the girls were selected amongst 25 finalists from around Australia.

On reflecting on this experience I believe that opportunities like this can often shape what we do in our lives, what hobbies we take up and what goals we can aspire to. I know that all the boys and girls who took part in the workshop commented on what a wonderful experience they had learning about an art that they would not normally have learned. I often keep in touch with the family of a past student who found out from a similar experience when he was in Year 6, that he possessed a love and talent in photography. This young man has pursued this art into high school with significant success. Not only has it given him much joy but he has continued to learn about himself as a person through this creative endeavor. Wouldn't it be great if every one of our children find something in their lives that they can feel passionate about; one that gives them a feeling of enormous satisfaction, growth and wonderment. We can assist children to discover their passions by providing them with a variety of opportunities and to share with them what is special to us. The school will continue to apply for the opportunity to host the photographic workshop and hopefully we will be selected again. Please note however that the free competition is open to all students yearly and we will ensure that information will be advertised when the time comes.

All finalists won a digital camera, a certificate of recognition and the honour of having their photo displayed at an exhibition at Juniper Hall, 250 Oxford St Paddington NSW 2021 from October 29 to February 14, excluding public holidays. 



IMMUNIZATION

2016 Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials

Currently only the Summer Sports of BASKETBALL, CRICKET, SOFTBALL & TENNIS are open and registrations close on Friday 30th October as these trials will be held in November 2015. All other sport registrations will open on 2nd November for 2016 trials.

Any Primary students enrolled in Year 5 and 6 in 2016 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term Four in 2015 and Term One in 2016.

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in Years 5 & 6 in 2016 be invited to attend.

Parramatta Diocesan trials will be held in the following sports:

*AFL (boys), Basketball (B&G), Cricket (B&G), Diving (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Football (B&G), Golf (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Netball (girls), Rugby League (11yrs & Opens), Rugby Union (boys), Softball (B&G), Tennis (B&G), & Touch(B&G).

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au. This online form is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST** for the 2016 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. Parents may complete this form to attend a selection trial. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and **MUST be approved by the child's school**. In order for the child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of the school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated.

All fields and especially "Representative Experience" MUST be completed.

I will email schools after the closing date of the 30th November and it is the responsibility of schools to notify students if they are successful or not in meeting the criteria. This will be done at least one week prior to the trial date if the student is to attend to the Parramatta Diocesan trial for their selected sport by providing a trial information sheet.

Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.




What costs will a scholarship cover?

Who can apply?

Parents/carers who are experiencing serious financial difficulty and have a student who meets the enrolment criteria and is commencing enrolment in a Catholic systemic school in the Diocese of Parramatta.*



Scholarship applications are made through the Catholic school at which you wish to enrol your child. Your local Catholic school can be found on the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta website www.parra.catholic.edu.au/find-a-school

To apply you will need to complete:

- · a school enrolment form
- a scholarship application form
- · a statement of financial position form

These are available from your local Catholic school or scholarship forms can be found on the fund's website. Applications are assessed on a means tested basis. www.scholarshipparra.catholic.edu.au

A scholarship is awarded for use at a particular school and is not transferrable between schools.

When to apply?

The best time to apply is when enrolling your child at the school.

Applications for scholarships may be made through your local Catholic school at any time of the school year up to 18 October of that year for commencement of enrolment in the following year. Applications are considered on a quarterly basis by the scholarship fund.






St Patrick's Sacramental Program 2015 - 2016

Mr Baird was fortunate to be able to attend the Sacraments Parent Information Evening last night (Wednesday 14th Oct). This was not only very informative but was also very professionally run by the Parish Sacrament Team.

Our Sacramental program is run with St Oliver's program.

In 2015 the parish will focus on:

The **Sacrament of Penance**. This will be in **Term 4** for children aged 7 or 8 (or thereabouts)

In 2016 the parish will focus on:

The Sacrament of **Eucharist in Term 2** (when these children will be 8 or 9)
The Sacrament of **Confirmation in Term 3** for children who are 10 years or older.

St Patrick's parent and children need to attend one of the Masses on Saturday 24th Oct or Sunday 25th Oct to enrol their child in the Sacrament process.

Prior to this Mass parents are required to go to the Parish website where, once hitting the Sacraments tab, they will find an **enrolment form**. This **should be completed as soon as possible**.

A copy of your child's / children's **baptismal certificate** will need to be provided if you child was baptised in a parish other than St Patrick's.
