



Dear Parents

Tomorrow is the last day of Term 2 and this completes Semester One. In writing this newsletter entry I cannot help but reflect on the year so far, one which gives me much satisfaction and with gratitude to all who have contributed to our school community in some way.



In a sermon given by Pope Francis at Vatican City in 2013 our Holy Father spoke of the importance of gratitude in our lives and especially in our family life. He commented on how saying, 'thank you' is sometimes much easier to say to colleagues or strangers than to members of our own family. Perhaps this has just become a bad habit as we get caught up in an attitude of complacency or familiarity. Perhaps we are led to a false sense that our loved ones know that we are grateful and do not need to hear it. I believe however that all humans enjoy feeling appreciated. It is not surprising then when I see the emotional response from people when they relay stories of how a member of their family expressed their gratitude towards them. This is particularly special when it is unexpected and is not connected to celebrations such as Christmas or birthdays, although these are important times too. In this sermon Pope Francis challenges us to reflect on how often we say 'thank you' in our families. He asks us to reflect on how often we say 'thank you' to those who help us or those close to us. Here are a few of Pope Francis' words of wisdom from the sermon at the Vatican:

- "If we can realize that everything is God's gift, how happy will our hearts be! Everything is his gift. He is our strength!"
- "Saying 'thank you' is such an easy thing, and yet so hard!. How often do we say 'thank you' to one another in our families?"
- "These are essential words for our life in common... If families can say these three things, they will be fine. 'Sorry,' 'excuse me,' 'thank you'."
- "All too often we take everything for granted!"

Perhaps over the next few weeks we could take up Pope Francis' challenge and use these precious words to those closest to us in the most unexpected times.

Before we part for a few weeks for the school holidays I would like to say thank you to all the children, parents and staff for all you have contributed this term, To the children; thank you for your courtesy and interest in learning. Thank you for your cooperation with your teachers and for your enthusiasm and wonderful behaviour. To our parents; thank you for your support and interest in the school. Thank you for your continued generosity, ideas and feedback. Thank you for giving up your time to be involved and for your assistance in and out of the classroom. To the staff; I wish to thank them for their dedication to your children, I thank them for their spirit of fun and patience and interest in their own professional learning. I wish to thank them for going above and beyond what is usual in their role as teachers or support staff in giving that little bit extra to make learning fun and engaging or to extend sympathy and support when needed. Finally I would like to thank the Dean of our Cathedral, Father Bob Bossini for his support, interest and weekly involvement in the school.

May you all have a happy and safe holiday and I look forward to seeing you again to start another wonderful term of learning.

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

AFTERNOON PICK UP UPDATE

Dear Parents.

Just to keep you updated on the afternoon pick up situation. After recently contacting Parramatta Council regarding the 'proposed' changing of the signs in Trott Street, I was informed that the changing of the signs was rejected by the committee. I had not been informed of this situation. I have since rung Parramatta Traffic Police and discussed the issue with them. I feel that the current system of pick up, where parents are permitted to wait on Trott Street until a space is made available, is working. The plan forward is for key stakeholders to meet



once again on site at the school for another review and for the results of this meeting to be taken back to a council meeting again. Whilst I am very disappointed with the lack of resolution with regard to the current issue and with the rejection of the change of signs to enable parents to wait along Trott Street I do understand the frustration experienced by residents and workers along this section of the street who are unable to enter their properties or businesses during this timeslot. I am confident with patience and persistence that the council and police will assist to find a mutually acceptable outcome for both the school and the local area. I have been very pleased with the approach demonstrated by representatives of both service organisations. I will keep you updated.





Parramatta Pool - Council Statement

Site chosen for new Parramatta swimming centre

The NSW Government has announced that the old Parramatta Golf Course has been identified as a potential site for a new aquatic centre to replace the Parramatta War Memorial pool. The site at the eastern end of the golf course will now be the subject of a State Government funded masterplan which will determine the land's suitability and also provide greater clarity about the costs of a new facility.

City of Parramatta Council will participate in this process to ensure key community, financial and other issues are adequately considered.

Planning work undertaken for the new Western Sydney Stadium has confirmed the need to permanently close the existing swimming centre due to a 50 per cent increase in seating capacity (20,000 to 30,000) and the need for improved circulation around the perimeter which will require a bigger footprint.

While the closure of the pool is unfortunate, the selection of an alternative site presents an opportunity for Council to design and build a state-of-the-art aquatic facility close to the CBD -- one which will serve the Parramatta community and visitors alike for many years to come.

The swimming centre is expected to remain open throughout the 2016/17 summer season until the end of March 2017. Its eventual closure however will mean short-term inconveniences for pool users, which we regret, and Council will work with the State Government to develop interim arrangements while new facilities are designed and constructed.

Council and the Government will now explore funding options and subject to the finalisation of these arrangements, the City of Parramatta will be responsible for the new centre's design and delivery.

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS AND CONTRACTORS

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that all volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

Volunteers – please click on 'Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for Volunteers' or access the form via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au, then click on 'Child Protection Training Forms' (halfway down page on the right hand side).



Then click on 'Volunteer Form' (halfway down page).

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are volunteering.

Contractors – please click on '<u>Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for Contractors</u> or access the form via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au, then click on 'Child Protection Training Forms' (halfway down page on the right hand side).



Then click on 'Contractor Form' (bottom of page).

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are contracting.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change

We thank all volunteers and contractors for their continued support of Catholic Education.
