Dear Parents

This Sunday, May 29th 2016, a number of our children will receive the sacrament of Eucharist for the first time - their First Holy Communion. This ceremony will take place at St Patrick's Cathedral at 9.30am and for the first time the school choir has been invited to sing with some of our leaders forming part of the hospitality group, welcoming parishioners. It is a wonderful opportunity to support these children and their families on such a special occasion and I encourage as many families to attend as possible.

One thing I remember as a child at my First Holy Communion was the anticipation that soon I would receive Jesus in the form of a host. The sense of awe that we have when we are young, with an unfailing faith, is something people can sometimes lose when we get older. Unlike children, adults begin to make other aspects of their lives more important and we often get caught up with the busyness of life, neglecting our spiritual wellbeing. I once heard a priest challenge the congregation by asking, "Do you really believe that Christ is present in the Eucharist? If people truly believed, then it is surprising that people do not attend mass every day of the year." he said. In many ways receiving Christ in the Eucharist unites us as a community and reminds us that we have a job to do and that is to be 'Jesus people'; people that stand for forgiveness, hope, love and compassion in our communities. We need this nourishment to assist us to continue to build the kingdom of God, in our own ways, in our own families and places of work, day after day. We need to support the vulnerable and work towards achieving justice. Receiving the Eucharist helps to remind us that this is what Christ did and modelled to each and every one of us. The reality is that this can sometimes be a challenge for people especially when we feel frustrated with each other or angry when we are hurt or misunderstood. Receiving communion helps us to 'recalibrate' and begin again together.

Last Sunday at my parish church of St Michael's Baulkham Hills two little girls received their First Holy Communion with the parish. They were surrounded by many family and friends all of whom came to watch them on this very special day. It is hoped that these family members will continue this support throughout the lives of these little girls. It is hoped that they will continue to attend mass and be nourished by the Eucharist weekly.

We wish the same for all the boys and girls from St Patrick's Parramatta who are soon to receive Jesus in the Eucharist for the first time as well. Can I ask you to remember all of this year's first holy communicants in your prayers.

CHANGE IN AFTERNOON PICK UP

Dear Parents

It is always our aim at St Patrick's Parramatta to ensure our policies and procedures are clear, effective and functional. We believe that the afternoon pick up system is going extremely well however we have had some concerns from parents needing to go to the classrooms for pick up by parents. The reason we instigated this was because the children in the amphitheatre could not hear their names being called if by chance their parents decided to pick them up by car. To mitigate this issue we have now installed 2 new speakers in the amphitheatre. This means we can go back to our original system. I am sure parents having to go up and down stairs to collect their children will be very pleased about this change in routine.

After school care - children sit in the 'Cave' area under the hall until they are picked up.

Drive through - children will remain in their classrooms until their names are called. A teacher on the playground will assist them to move swiftly to the gate and teachers on the street will assist them to enter the car if necessary

Children to be picked up by parents - K—Yr 6 will be brought down to the amphitheatre to wait for parents etc. If they are called for drive through they will now hear their names.

Children catching the bus or going by walk - will be taken across the crossing by a teacher.

With this system it is hoped that no parent will need to walk to the classrooms but will have the convenience of their children waiting for them in the amphitheatre.

At this stage we have not received any information from Parramatta Council regarding the change of signage on Trott Street. Our current procedures have been accepted so we will continue the drive thru pickup as per normal.

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES – NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS AND CONTRACTORS

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that all volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

Volunteers – please click on '<u>Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for Volunteers</u>' or access the form via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage <u>http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au</u>, then click on 'Child Protection Training Forms' (halfway down page on the right hand side).



Then click on 'Volunteer Form' (halfway down page).

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are volunteering.

Contractors – please click on '<u>Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for Contractors</u> or access the form via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage <u>http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au</u>, then click on 'Child Protection Training Forms' (halfway down page on the right hand side).



Then click on 'Contractor Form' (bottom of page).

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are contracting.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change

Year 4 Science Incursion Experience

On Tuesday 24th May 2016 Year 4 students and teachers participated in a Science and Technology workshop called Forces, Friction and Movement run by Fizzics Education.

We carried out experiments to explore and investigate how forces and friction effect movement. We learnt about Sir Isaac Newton's law that "An object at rest stays at rest and an object in motion stays in motion with the same speed and in the same direction unless acted upon by an unbalanced force". We also learnt about the concepts of inertia, momentum and that every action has an equal or opposite reaction.

We learnt how to pull a cloth out from under things on a table (That's right!!!! It's science not magic), how to balance objects and why they balance, how to make objects move using gas (oxygen), that forces can go through water and solids, that friction needs pressure and surface area to work and experience what it would be like to turn a spacecraft.



We had a lot of fun experimenting and it was great to have the hands-on experience to see what we are learning about in class.
