## Dear Parents

On Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> June there is a Staff Development Day for all staff. On this day they will be participating in an inservice on the new K to 10 Geography syllabus which is soon to be implemented at our school (Semester 2). For most of us the study of Geography was confined to Years 7 to 12 and needed to be selected as an elective, but the new curriculum acknowledges that even children as young as those in Kindergarten can begin to learn about basic Geographical concepts. So what is Geography? Geography is the study of people and places and their interactions. There are two dimensions through which we study Geography:

### **Spatial Dimension**

• Where things are and why they are there for example why rainforests are positioned where they are.

## **Ecological dimension**

Human interaction with environments, for example the clearing of rainforests for agriculture

As you can imagine the study of geography integrates very well with the other key learning areas of Religious Education, Mathematics, Science and Technology and English. The children will also learn about the use of Geographical tools which are used by geographers during an inquiry to acquire, process and communicate geographical information. Some of these tools will include the use of: maps, fieldwork, graphs and statistics, special technologies such as virtual maps and satellite images and visual representations such as photographs, paintings and illustrations. Sounds sophisticated but the reality is that these tools are already part of the children's world. Many of them are already exposed to Global Positioning Systems (GPS) in your cars.

Some of you may be wondering, 'what will now happen the Key Learning Area of HSIE ie Human Society and its Environment?' HSIE has now been replaced by a syllabus for History K to 10 and a syllabus for Geography K to 10. For your information, in relation to Geography here are the main changes.

# **GEOGRAPHY WHAT IS SIMILAR?**

Students will continue to:

- investigate environments and communities across local to global scales
- develop an understanding of being informed, responsible and active citizens
- undertake inquiry-based learning to explore and understand the world.

### **GEOGRAPHY WHAT IS DIFFERENT?**

- Key inquiry questions provide a focus for learning.
- An emphasis on contemporary geographical concepts such as place and sustainability.
- A more specific focus on geographical skills and tools, for example maps and spatial technologies.
- More emphasis on the role of fieldwork in geographical inquiry.

I know the staff are really looking forward to preparing wonderful geography learning experiences and programs, for your children, for use in Terms 3 and 4.

# Military repatriation welcomes home Australians

Today our Year 6 students represented the school and showed their respect at a special procession to welcome home 33 Australian service personnel and dependents, including 22 Vietnam War veterans, in one of the largest, single military repatriations in this country's history. The Terendak Repatriation procession passed through the Parramatta CBD on its route from Richmond RAAF to Rookwood. This was an important opportunity for our students to engage with Australia's military history and current military operations, and reflect on the sacrifices of our defence personnel.

# **ATTENDANCE/ABSENCES**

Children are required by legislation to attend school each day, and we are required by law to keep records of each child's absences from school. For this reason if your child is unable to attend school, a note must be sent the day the child returns to school giving the reason for the absence. This can be done by letter or by using the school's Skoolbag App.

The absence needs to be explained within 7 days of the absence or it will be changed to unexplained and cannot be altered if the note is received after that time. All absences are shown on the child's report.

Every Friday a report is generated to list the outstanding absences from the previous week. A letter will be sent to parents requesting an explanation for the absence. Even if you have sent the absence through our Skoolbag app sometimes you may still receive a letter because the app may not functioning correctly and the absence is still marked outstanding. We will do our best to fix the problem however we ask that you sign the note and return it to the office when your child next returns to school.

# **Radical Funding Freeze proposal**

Government and non-government schools deserve to be appropriately funded to ensure they achieve high quality outcomes for every student in every school.

The Centre for Policy Development's radical proposal to freeze funding for low fee Catholic schools would threaten parents' right to choose a faith-based education for their child.

Every student deserves a base level of educational funding in Australia. A funding freeze would put pressure on school fees at a time when many families in western Sydney are already struggling to make ends meet. Many parents who send their child to a Catholic school in western Sydney make big sacrifices to pay school fees because it is the best fit for their child's educational needs and religious preferences.

Catholic schools receive government funding because they play an integral role in providing education in the community. In western Sydney, Catholic schools educate one in four students. Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta is one of the largest employers in western Sydney with over 5,000 staff. A funding freeze for low fee Catholic schools would not only have an adverse affect on our students and their families, but also our teachers and staff, local business and wider community. It would also put more pressure on the State government to cater for new public school places.

Students and families should not be disadvantaged for choosing a Catholic education for their child. We need to stop pitting non-government and government schools against each other and allow diversity and choice for families in the type of education they want for their children.
