Last week Mrs O'Dwyer and I had the pleasure of judging the school final of the Year 6 Voice of Youth competition. I say pleasure, with some reservation, as the quality of the 10 speeches was so high that this was not an easy task. In saying this, however, we loved listening to our seniors express their ideas on a range of interesting topics of importance to them.

To judge public speaking 3 main areas are considered; matter, method and manner. Matter involves the speech content; What is said. Method is the speech structure; How it is organized and Manner is speech presentation; How it is said. All these factors combine to assist the speaker to engage, entertain or inform the audience or persuade them to think about issues in a particular way. This year the three school finalists chosen certainly challenged our thinking in very positive ways. Antonia Behan spoke about the importance of choices with her speech about a road less travelled. Claudia Yaghi encouraged us to think positively about life, especially how we view ourselves and Kayleigh Figueredo challenged us to work together to fight against the scourge of racism.

The Voice of Youth is an annual competition which has been held in the Parramatta Diocese for the past 30 years. It involves all Year 6 students across the 54 western Sydney Catholic schools. Our three school finalists will now compete on Monday 22nd August at our cluster final involving St Oliver's Harris Park, Mother Theresa Westmead and Sacred Heart Westmead. The winner of this round will then move on to the semi final for the eastern division and the winners of the semi final will compete at final level.

We would like to congratulate all Year 6 students on the achievement of presenting speeches, especially the 10 students who got to the grade final level. Congratulations and in no particular order: Jake El-Sabbagh – The best things in life are free, Sophie Morgan – Society is socially challenged, An Le – The essence of time, Isabella Loader – A home for the homeless in your heart, Emmaline Didic - Deception, Alana Michael - What's the difference and Caitlin Polintan - Homeless. That is hope. Mary had it. And that hope has renewed everything.





ATTENDANCE/ABSENCES

Children are required by legislation to attend school each day, and we are required by law to keep records of each child's absences from school. For this reason if your child is unable to attend school, a note must be sent the day the child returns to school giving the reason for the absence. This can be done by letter or by using the school's Skoolbag App (please see instructions below).

The absence needs to be explained within 7 days of the absence or it will be changed to unexplained and cannot be altered if the note is received after that time. All absences are shown on the child's report.



Step 1—Open your skoolbag app

<u>Step 2</u>—From home page (picture1) select eforms

<u>Step 3</u>—Select Absentee form (picture 2)

<u>Step 4</u>—Complete the absentee form with your child's details. (picture 3)

<u>Step 5</u>—Submit the form which will then be emailed to St Patricks to enable the office to mark the absent as explained.

NB: The dates should show the first day of absent and the last day the child is absent.

During the past 2 weeks we have had many children absent with sickness. We would very much appreciate if your child is still unwell they do not return to school until they are feeling much better. This will alleviate the passing on of illnesses to the other students.




