A few weeks ago I shared with you the process and details of student leadership at St Patrick's Parramatta. Students in Year 5 are currently getting ready to nominate some of their peers for the student leaders' positions.



This week my thoughts take me back to my visit to Rome in 2014, particularly the audience with the leader of our Catholic Church, our Holy Father, Pope Francis. For those who have not had the blessing of experiencing a visit to the Vatican it is truly one to look forward to. Keenly anticipated, our coach, filled with pilgrims, left our hotel very early in the morning. We were soon joined by thousands of pilgrims, young and old, from all over the world waving flags and streamers. Once past security we quickly found our seats in the booked area and settled in for a long, but worthwhile wait. There was something truly wonderful when you realize that you are indeed part of a world community of faithful people, a World Church, who share a belief like ours — our Catholic faith. The atmosphere was indescribable in that it was like a rock concert filled with the sounds of cheers and chants and that of pilgrims gathered saying the rosary. Ms Azar, on her recent visit to Poland for World Youth Day would have experienced this Universal Church. On the pope's arrival, the square lifted with the roar of elation, and it was at that point we realized that Pope Francis would be travelling around and amongst the people, on top of his 'Pope Mobile'. Now and then he would stop to speak to someone or to lift and bless a baby. People rushed to the barrier fences just to catch a closer glimpse of him, stretching out their hands and calling out his name. All the while he waved and smiled with an expression of genuine care and enjoyment at being amongst us.

By what is it about this leader that has renewed the Church in a way that has not been seen to this intensity before? What can we learn about leadership from him? I think the reason this man has had such an impact in such a relatively short time, is that Pope Francis seems to hold his love of people above and beyond all other things. Rules and systems in society are important because we all have a right to live in safety and dignity, but not when the makers of the rules lose sight of why the rules are there in the first place – people and the world we live in. Many stories are told of when Pope Francis has gone out of his way to ensure that others are treated with respect and dignity; the time he asked his driver to stop at the side of the road to give a blessing to a sick child on a bed which had been wheeled out by his family, is but one example of the way he shows God's love in a very human and real way. The saying, "Actions speak louder than words" is one of my favourite sayings and Pope Francis is a leader that epitomizes this sentiment. In striving to be like such a leader one may get the impression that it demands perfection, however perfection is both unrealistic and lacks humanness. I think it is authenticity that Pope Francis demonstrates, integrity in a very inclusive and compassionate way. After all we can only be ourselves and hopefully by the end of our lives – the best version of ourselves.

As we head toward the end of the year, let us think and pray for all who find themselves in leadership for 2017, especially for newly appointed Bishop of Parramatta, Bishop Vincent Long Van Ngyuen; that they may be wise and considerate of all people and that they may demonstrate the same love and dignity Our Lord Jesus Christ taught through His ministry. Please especially keep the students in Year 5 in your thoughts and prayers.



2017 Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials

Any Primary students enrolled in Parramatta Diocesan Schools in Year 5 and 6 in 2017 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term One/Two in 2017 (Winter Sports - AFL, Football, Hockey, Netball, Rugby League League, Rugby Union & Touch).

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in Years 5 & 6 in 2017 be invited to attend.

Parramatta Diocesan trials in 2017 will be held in the following sports:

*AFL (boys), Diving (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Football (B&G), Golf (B&G), Hockey (B&G),
Netball (girls), Rugby League (11vrs & Opens), Rugby Union (boys), & Touch(B&G).

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au. This online form is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST**

for the 2017 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. You may complete this form to attend a selection trial or if you have been selected in a representative squad or team. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and **MUST** be approved by your child's school. In order for your child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of your school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. **Please complete all fields and especially "Representative Experience".**

Please ensure that the SUBMIT button has been pressed upon completing the form and notification email will be sent to the parent/guardian listed on the form confirming this expression of interest has been received.

Your child's school will notify you one week prior to the trial date if your child is to attend to the Parramatta Diocesan trial for their selected sport by providing a trial information sheet.

Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

Winter Sports Registrations close Friday 3rd February 5pm.
