## St Patrick's Primary School Newsletter

Dear Parents

Yesterday, Wednesday 14th February Year 1 to 6 gathered in the cathedral to celebrate Ash Wednesday. It is marked by the distribution of ashes made from the burning of palms from the previous year's Palm Sunday. The ashes used came from the burning of the palms at Tuesday's morning assembly. Father Bob introduced this symbolic action with prayer, blessed the palms and explained to the children the importance of this element/ritual to our Religious Education and growing faith.

In his beautiful homily Father Bob continued the theme introduced at the Opening School Mass where he spoke about the importance of good foundations in our lives. He related this concept to the foundations of a skyscraper which need to be deep, strong and reliable. He connected this image with the foundation stones the children were holding during mass: These foundation stones had key gospel values displayed. They were: Honesty, Compassion, Good Deeds, Resilience, Forgiveness, Justice, Tolerance and Respect.

Father Bob challenged all of us in the cathedral to think of the opposite condition of these values and to reflect which one spoke to us. He then sent us away with the task of choosing one of the values to focus on and to write our reflections on how we are demonstrating this faith in action weekly in our religion books or journal. This reflective practice, even identifying times when we have not shown compassion, for example, is a very important skill in developing empathy and mindfulness.

During the Ash Wednesday Liturgy Father Bob went one step further in explaining that if we truly tried to embed this chosen value in our lives that this would lead to positive changes. I imagine this change have an effect on us and those around us. He encouraged us to pray, fast and help the poor to enrich this process.

Already today I noticed children reflecting in their religion books on what Father spoke about. I feel that this is a very worthwhile and simple activity that you can do as a family. Let us pray that this Lent we will transform ourselves, in some way, towards becoming the people God created us to be.




Our writing prompt this week is:

### **ENROLMENTS FOR 2018 KINDERGARTEN ARE NOW OPEN**

Enrolment packs for Kindergarten 2018 are available from the school between the hours of 9am -3pm Monday to Friday.

When you return the enrolment you will need to bring your child's original Birth Certificate, Baptismal Certificate, Passports (parent's and child's if born overseas), Immunization Certificates and proof of address (council rates, drivers licence). We will

photo copy these and return them to you at this time.

Enrolment forms are required to be returned by 31<sup>st</sup> March 2018.

### **ENROLMENT CRITERIA**

### Who can enrol in a Catholic school?

Children whose fifth birthday occurs on or before 31 July are eligible for enrolment for Kindergarten that year. By law, all children must be enrolled in school by their sixth birthday. For more information on the Diocesan guidelines for enrolment please see www.parra.catholic.edu.au

### What if my child already attends a Catholic primary school in the Diocese?

A child who has completed primary education in a Catholic parish-based primary school will usually be offered continuity of enrolment in a Catholic secondary school. If no places exist at the chosen school, Catholic Education's Director System Performance will assist families to enrol in another Catholic secondary school in the Diocese.

Dear brothers and sisters in ministry,

Earlier this week, Fairfax Media ran a series of articles on the alleged wealth of the Catholic Church in Australia and the way it deals with survivors of abuse. These articles appear to be part of a relentless campaign with similar articles likely to be published in the future.

Though these articles are mostly concerned with the financial position of the Archdioceses of Sydney and Melbourne, it is a timely reminder for us to look at what the Diocese of Parramatta is doing in the area of providing justice to survivors of abuse.

As the articles highlight, in the light of the extent of the abuse in the Church and its handling by some Church leaders, it is reasonable for people to have lost trust in the Church. As the Diocese of Parramatta, we need to rebuild this trust. It is incumbent upon us to rebuild a broken Church.

In the Diocese of Parramatta, we are constantly looking at ways to enact and demonstrate accountability and transparency in the responsible administration of the resources of the Church, despite the media reports.

In the Diocese of Parramatta, our commitment to survivors of abuse comes first. We take this commitment very seriously. We have honoured most claims of abuse brought forward from survivors and we are in the process of finalising other claims. We also have arrangements in place to meet the financial obligations to survivors of abuse.

Any suggestion that we would not honour financial commitments to a survivor of abuse to "protect" our financial assets is wrong and misleading.

It is important to note that the Catholic Church in Australia was the first organisation to commit to a National Redress Scheme. We remain fully supportive of this endeavour.

What needs to be clear is that "Church property", usually acquired through the generous donations and volunteer work of generations of Catholics, cannot simply be compared to a normal commercial building. Church property usually belongs to an individual parish or is held in trust. Comparing a commercial building to a Church property is not the same thing and would be like comparing apples to oranges.

As Bishop of Parramatta, I reiterate my pledge to work towards having the best systems in place to protect children from harm in the future when they engage in ministry of the Diocese of Parramatta.

My offer to meet with every survivor of abuse in this Diocese is ongoing and I will continue my work in this area.

The Diocese of Parramatta remains committed to responding to survivors of abuse with justice, compassion, integrity, care and professionalism.



Seminar entry & NEW School membership (until 31 May 2019) Anxiety is an emotion commonly experienced by everyone when faced with challenging situations. School life has daily challenges for students needing to be able to organise themselves, and demonstrate previous learning whilst acquiring new learning. These attempts are frequently observed by classmates and in many instances evaluated by teachers. Students with learning difficulties are likely to experience greater challenges relative to their peers. Research suggests a higher prevalence of anxiety in children with learning difficulties which is partially related to these extra life challenges they face.

This workshop aims to increase parents', teachers' and other professionals' understanding of anxiety in children and adolescents, and to provide a repertoire of cognitive and behavioural strategies that can be used to support them in managing their anxiety at home and in school.
