Greetings Parents, teachers, students and other school members.

I'm Stephanie Saab your STEM leader for 2018. This week I would like to share with you some exciting things that have happened over the past week.



Last week Mrs Nash visited Year six to introduce us to a Makey Makey.



Makey Makey, an Invention Kit for Everyone, is an electronic invention tool and toy that allows users to connect everyday objects to computer programs. Using a circuit board, alligator clips, and a USB cable, the toy uses electrical signals to send the computer either a keyboard stroke or other instruments. This function allows the Makey Makey to work with any computer program or web page since all computer programs and webpages take keyboard and mouse click inputs. A Makey Makey is a controller that is able to replace a keyboard. We experimented using all kinds of fruit, veggies, rubber bands, split pins and many more fascinating materials. Mrs Nash explained to us why all these non-resistant materials allow electricity to flow through them.



This was a very fun and interesting incursion and on behalf of year six I would like to say thank you to Mrs Nash, Miss Fabri and the Classroom teachers for this fantastic opportunity and experience.

If you would like to purchase a Makey Makey you are able to get them online for about \$50-\$70 including what is in the photograph above or you are able to check any electronic shop such as JB HIFI for better deals.

Celebrations of Learning

Dear Parents,

As explained in previous emails we will now begin a cycle of what we call 'Celebrations of Learning'. These will take many forms in the classrooms depending on what the teachers are trying to showcase. Some key factors to consider:

• Celebrations will be held in the classrooms or an advertised space, such as the library.

• They may take the form of a culminating presentation eg results of a inquiry project eg a design and make, an EXPO stand.

- May take the form of an open classroom which will give visitors the opportunity to view learning journals or work displayed around the room.
- May give visitors the opportunity to watch their children in the process of collaborative learning and problem solving.
- They may take place on days other than Fridays
- You may be invited to form the audience for an 'end product' or goal setting with children.

• Be mindful that this is an opportunity to celebrate the learning with the children and teachers. This is NOT a time to ask for an interview to see how your child is going. These meetings need to be arranged through an appointment to enable preparation and reflection by the staff.

NOTE PLEASE - GUIDELINES

The staff is very mindful that children like some adults may feel in a vulnerable position being watched so we ask all adults to show utmost respect by:

- Remaining quiet when children are presenting/speaking.
- Adhering to our policy of confidentiality regarding children's learning by not making comments to other parents regarding individual children.
- Assisting only when asked to do so please. This is their learning journey and we know that making errors is an important part of that journey.

• We do not expect all parents to attend every opportunity and fully understand that many parents are working and cannot make it. We will do our best to emphasize this with the children.


Book Club LOOP
















Dear Parents/ Guardians
