Dear Parents.

At the end of the term you will be receiving your child's mid-year report. There will also be an opportunity for you to meet with your child(rens) class teacher for up to 15 mins to see how they are travelling in their learning journey. Some grades will ask the children to come to the interview to be a part of the discussion around the learning and maybe to set goals for the next semester. You will be informed by letter if the children are required at the meeting. Meetings will be booked online and these are available now.

For those who are new to school reports, reports follow the A-E common grade scale for the 7 Key Learning Areas for Grades 1 to 6. The scale describes; The depth of knowledge and understanding and the range of skills that students working at that standard typically show. In line with the National Curriculum the strands within the subject are not reported separately. Knowledge and skills are seen as fully integrated eg, a student uses the skills of talking/listening, reading and writing in composing and responding to text within the English Curriculum. Computer skills and the use of the Library are also not seen as separate from the key areas of learning but rather integral tools with associated skills within each of them.

Other features of the report include;

- a report on effort
- information about the distribution of grades across the year that is how many students achieved A, B, C etc
- comments for the three key areas of Religious Education, English and Mathematics
- a grading for Personal and Social Behaviours and Learning Habits
- a general comment.

In keeping with Government guidelines, Kindergarten reports do not use an A-E common grade scale as they are still emerging as learners. There are however three brief descriptors; Working Towards, Working At and Working Beyond for each Key Learning Area.

A record of absences and partial absences is given at the end of the report. It is worthy of note that significant absences and/or partial absences can have a significant impact on a child's learning and thus the report results.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the school community for their support during Ms Fabri's period of leave. Along with all of you, I look forward to welcoming her back next week.

URGENT "Drive Through" Considerations

Thank you so much to the parents who have made an effort to support last week's request to be a little more patient when using our 'Drive Through' service. I have been able to observe the Trott St and Grose St intersection on a number of occasions and am very pleased that parents are making the effort not to block Grose St. I understand that some parents have been asked to circle the block, and yes I am aware that a few people have done this a number of times. I am sure our local businesses are appreciative as well and ask that you continue to observe these requests even when the police or staff are not there to prompt you.

Just to remind you again:

- No parking in Ross St and Trott St before 3pm
- Start to line up in Trott St from 3pm
- If there is no space in Trott St please DO NOT stop in Grose St
- Circle the block until there is room to join the queue in Trott St
- Consider coming later we offer the service until 3.30pm

We ask that there is **NO lining up in Grose St at any time** as this street is a busy through road from Church St to O'Connell St. When we block Grose St cars have no alternative but to drive up the wrong side of the road.

If you are after some exercise consider the other alternative and park your car. Then enjoy a lovely, brisk afternoon walk. I have noticed that more families are taking up this option.

Please note that our Procedures have not changed we just ask that you consider the road rules and others in the community.

Year 5 excursion to The Rocks

Last week Year 5 had an excursion to the Rocks in Sydney. We went by bus and when we arrived there we were introduced to Rangers Toni and Kirsten, our tour guides. We discussed what Year 5 have been exploring in history such as Sydney Cove and the Parramatta settlement in the 1800's.

Our first stop was at a replica of a poor family's home. Ranger Kristen showed the cramped conditions that early settlers had to live in, which was up to nine people living in two small rooms. We then went into another room which was once a common kitchen area and Ranger Kristen told us if we were really quiet we could still hear the women cooking.

Then we took a stroll on the smallest street in Sydney and were shown homes that were designed by Italian and Irish immigrants. We also visited a rich man's home and its beautifully carved sandstone blocks.

Then we swapped groups and Ranger Toni took us to the Suez Canal, one of the first sewers in Sydney and then to the first hospital in Sydney which treated patients with scurvy, small pox and the measles that come from England.

Finally we went to the first bank and police station where Ranger Toni told us about the biggest bank robbery ever, and that the criminals were never caught.

After the tour we took a hike up to Observatory Hill. We had lunch and spent the rest of the day sketching, writing, and playing games. Then we had to go back to school and we said bye to Ranger Toni and Kristen. They were great tour guides. We had so much fun and learnt so much more on the Australian colonies.
