Dear Parents

Thank you for the many expressions of welcome received this week since my return from leave. It was a wonderfully refreshing time and I found that learning about other countries and cultures including their history is so fascinating. I know that many travellers experience the feeling that I felt on returning to Sydney after a 14 hour flight and that is that "There is no place like home!' Whist I just loved my travels, I do believe that Australia is one of the best countries in the world and that we are very lucky to be living in this clean, organised and safe place. It makes me thank my parents for having the courage to leave their homeland to come here.

May I continue by thanking Mrs Benkovich for her leadership of our community during this time and to the staff for supporting her. I have enjoyed hearing all about the wonderful parent events, especially the Mother's Day evening and the Maths Information session which sounded very successful. On my return it is good to see that the children have kept up their enthusiasm for learning and good behaviour. Well Done!

In the newsletter last week Mrs Benkovich wrote about our mid year reports soon to be distributed to children. Her summary explained the E to A reporting and some of the subjects and items featured. Since my return I have been reading the children's reports and an aspect that always draws my attention and one that sometimes engenders less attention in the home is the table found on the last page.

This table outlines the Personal and Social Development and Learning Behaviours demonstrated by the student and will indicate to you whether your child is displaying particular learning skills under the following standards; Enthusiastic and Conscientious, Usually or Greater Application Required. These areas are critical to all subjects - to all learning.

When I listen to educational speakers commenting on contemporary learning, they often remind us that the jobs that our Kindergarten children will most likely be engaging in, have not even been invented yet. Whilst teachers understand that content is necessary in giving learning a context, most would acknowledge that with the continual 'information explosion' it is no longer possible for anyone to know all the information about the world which was once possible and expected by students of the past. The focus has shifted. Learners are required to do more than, 'know' but rather are required to think and to do this in conjunction with other thinkers. They are required to be adaptable, flexible, be creative, be problem solvers, be inventors, ask questions, manage and give feedback and more importantly manage change; to learn, unlearn and relearn. Children are required to work cooperatively, to organize and pace their assignments, work independently, and keep on task. How often have we as adults been required to do this in our workplaces? These skills require students to accept responsibility for their own learning and this begins with accepting responsibility for their own behaviour. This is an empowering position as it is teaching children that they are capable of being in control of outcomes.

When reading reports I am always keenly interested in whether the child is beginning to take responsibility for their own actions; including that of learning and if they are developing collaborative skills. I am interested in their ability to demonstrate independence and organisational skills and if they are beginning to show empathy - emotional intelligence towards others.

When you receive your child's report I encourage you to spend a little extra time on this section and to assist them to work towards an enthusiastic and conscientious approach to all they do.

URGENT "Drive Through" Considerations

Thank you so much to the parents who have made an effort to support last week's request to be a little more patient when using our 'Drive Through' service. I have been able to observe the Trott St and Grose St intersection on a number of occasions and am very pleased that parents are making the effort not to block Grose St. I understand that some parents have been asked to circle the block, and yes I am aware that a few people have done this a number of times. I am sure our local businesses are appreciative as well and ask that you continue to observe these requests even when the police or staff are not there to prompt you.

Just to remind you again:

- No parking in Ross St and Trott St before 3pm
- Start to line up in Trott St from 3pm
- If there is no space in Trott St please **DO NOT** stop in Grose St
- Circle the block until there is room to join the queue in Trott St
- Consider coming later we offer the service until 3.30pm

We ask that there is **NO lining up in Grose St at any time** as this street is a busy through road from Church St to O'Connell St. When we block Grose St cars have no alternative but to drive up the wrong side of the road.

If you are after some exercise consider the other alternative and park your car. Then enjoy a lovely, brisk afternoon walk. I have noticed that more families are taking up this option.



Future Care Mobile Dental Services

Information for Parents

What service is offered?

Future Care Mobile Dental Services is a unique initiative that provides high quality, on-site, general dental care to children aged 2-17. Under the Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS), funded by the Australian Federal Government, our service for eligible* students comes at no cost to the school or the parents.

Who are the dentists?

Future Care Mobile Dental Services comprises of a team of accredited and experienced dentists with a keen desire to provide the essential dental care to your child.

What sort of services are provided?

After receiving written consent from you as their parent/guardian, your child will be provided the following services:

- Dental health education
- Comprehensive oral examination and treatment plan
- Cleaning of teeth and fluoride application
- If applicable (and with further parental consent) on our return visit to your school x-ray, fillings, fissure seals, extractions if required.

What does it cost?

<u>Eligible students:</u> *For eligible students the total benefit is capped at \$1000.00 over a two calendar year period. We confirm eligibility with Medicare prior to your child's consultation with our dentist.

<u>Ineligible students</u>: For students not covered under the CDBS we can provide the same level of preventative care for \$59.00 per student.

Should X-Rays/fillings/fissure seals/extractions, etc. be required such will be detailed on the Treatment Plan that will be provided to your child. We normally return to the school to undertake this restorative work and contact all parents to explain what work is required and if agreed the child is booked into our clinic for our next visit. For students who are ineligible to be Bulk Billed we provide the parent with a quote as per the CDBS bulk billed fee schedule. Payment is available via EFT/Credit Card/PayPal for your convenience.

How can my child participate in the program?

Your child can participate in the program after filling in our consent form and medical questionnaire. We need these returned prior to your child being seen by our dentist.
