Dear Parents,

Last week we celebrated Catholic Schools Week, "Celebrating Learning together in Community". We commenced the week with a beautiful Welcoming Ceremony lead by our student leaders from the Religious Education Committee. The children in Kindergarten and from various classes around the school were welcomed into the St Patrick's family. After the ceremony a magnificent morning tea was organised by the Year 1 parents. Thank you to Mrs Rahme and all the Year 1 parents who in some way helped.

After morning tea many of the parents and visitors had the opportunity to visit classrooms. Maths was the main subject the children were involved in at this time. I noticed many of the children explaining to their parents what they were learning and what the task required. It is so good to see children demonstrating their thinking and not just performing formulas. The week continued with the schools involvement in Ash Wednesday Mass and in the Catholic Schools Assembly.

Tomorrow, Friday 15th March the school will celebrate St Patrick's Day (17th March, 2019) and this year, the feast day of our patron St Patrick, serves to conclude the celebrations for Catholic Schools Week.

The life of St Patrick is such an interesting one and his association with the Irish people, combined with the enormous contribution the Irish convicts and settlers had on the establishment of the first colony, particularly Parramatta, makes him very significant to us. Just like St Patrick these early convicts and free men and women brought the Word of God to these early settlers. It is through these early Irish Catholics that the first Australian Church was established and from there the first Catholic Schools. St Patrick's is known to be the oldest Catholic School in Australia, not on the original site; What an honour to have such an illustrious history. For those of you that are interested I have copied a brief history of our school from our website

St Patrick's is the oldest Catholic School in Australia

- The parish school was established by Fr Therry in Hunter Street in 1820. In 1837 the school was relocated next to St Patrick's Church. In 1874 the girls and smaller boys were separated and taught in a school opposite the church.
- From 1874-1888 the Sisters of Mercy, Head House Monte Saint Angelo, North Sydney, were teaching at St Patrick's School Parramatta, in a building which was standing in front of the present O.L.M.C. in Victoria Road, then known as Pennant Street.
- The Sisters of Mercy from Callan, Ireland, then took up residence in Parramatta on 8th December 1888 at the invitation of Cardinal Moran. They re-opened the school on Monday 10th December, just two days later with an enrolment of 55 pupils.
- In 1926 that building was demolished and a new building was erected at the corner of Villiers Street and Ross Street, the current site.
- The senior girls moved to Westmead in 1966 to form Catherine McAuley High School. The primary school remains to this present day.
- The Sisters of Mercy handed the responsibility for the School to the first lay Principal, Ms Joan Coyle in 1985.

ENROLMENTS FOR 2020 KINDERGARTEN



Sibling enrolments forms are due back no later than Friday 29th of March 2019.

When you return the enrolment you will need to bring your child's original Birth Certificate, Baptismal Certificate, Passports (parent's and child's if born overseas), Immunization Certificates and proof of address (council rates, drivers licence). We will photo copy these and return them to you at this time.

Afternoon 'Drive Through'

This week our local Parking Police were doing their job and asked parents waiting in line before 3pm to move along. There is community concern that our parents are blocking off the traffic from Trott St to Grose St and into Villiers St well before 3pm. We understand the difficulties around parking however our goal as a Catholic community is to work in partnership with our community members. We ask you to respect the local businesses and keep driveways clear during pick up time.

We have been asked on numerous occasions that, until the cars start moving at 3pm, we not block Trott St and Grose St. At 3pm we ask that you begin lining up in Trott St. While we understand that it is not ideal, last year the police asked that you continue to drive around until there is room in Trott St to join the queue. The other alternative is to park and enjoy a lovely, brisk afternoon walk. We have noticed that more families are taking up this option.

Parents are expected to follow the road signage as the school is not responsible for parents who break the law.

'Under the **No Parking** rule, motorists can't stop for longer than two minutes and can't move more than three metres from their vehicle. **No Stopping** means vehicles can't stop under any circumstances'.

EARLY YEARS ASSESSMENTS (EYA) - LITERACY

Improving learning outcomes for all students is at the heart of the Catholic Education, Diocese of Parramatta's (CEDP) strategic intent.

The National Inquiry into the Teaching of Literacy (2005) stated that "the assessment of all children by their teachers at school entry and regularly during the early years of schooling is of critical importance to the teaching of reading, and in particular, to identify children who are at risk of not making adequate progress." They concluded that early assessment is a key responsibility of system and school literacy planning.

In light of this diocesan statement Early Years Assessments are undertaken by classroom teachers of Kindergarten, Year One and Year Two in all primary schools across the Diocese of Parramatta. These have been taking place over the last few weeks, including this week and the diocese supports schools by funding the replacement of class teachers for the day to undertake individual literacy interviews with the children. Some assessments are conducted as a whole class. This very important literacy data is then analyzed and used at a student, school and diocesan level and compared to mid year and end of year results.

How will tailored testing work?

During the test, students are presented with sets of questions based on their performance. Many of these questions are of mid-range complexity for each year level, but some are of higher or lower complexity. Students who experience difficulty early in the test are given some questions of lower complexity, more suited to their performance. These students are less likely to become discouraged as they progress through the tests. High-achieving students are given questions that they find more challenging.

Students who complete a more complex pathway are more likely to achieve a higher score (and a higher band placement). Students who answer the same number of questions correctly, but follow a less complex pathway, will achieve a lower score.
