Dear Parents,

Last Friday was World Teacher's Day. At St Patrick's Parramatta we will be celebrating this special day tomorrow. It is an opportunity for students and families to acknowledge the wonderful work teachers do all around the world. Most people I know have been influenced by a teacher at some stage in their lives. They may have been a teacher in primary school, high school, technical college or university. They may be teachers in a sporting or leisure context or life skills. For some of us our favourite teacher is our parish priest or pastor who demonstrates for us how to be wise, patient and compassionate.

One year we asked the children what makes a good teacher. None of their responses surprised us, however, what did surprise us, was the maturity and wisdom expressed by the children – even the young ones. They commented that a good teacher is kind. That quality seemed to be the most popular. Good teachers, they said, are those that help them to learn. They appreciated teachers that knew their topics and were organized and prepared. Children liked teachers who let them make mistakes without getting 'cranky' and they especially liked teachers who could take a joke now and then. From what I have gained from their responses they didn't mind firmness, but appreciated fairness also. They said that a good teacher is one that listens to children. All the children's responses were quite insightful and their pictures of teachers were equally delightful. The answer I like the most, however, was a little girl who said 'a good teacher is one that teaches from her heart not her head only. Very special indeed!

When I ask teachers why they chose this vocation, the most common reason is that they wanted to make a difference in the lives of children. What we may not recognise however is that in hoping to make a difference what really happens is that our students and families make a difference to us; to what makes us the people we are today. So thank you!

May I take this opportunity to thank the wonderful teachers at St Patrick's Parramatta. Their dedication and interest in your children is obvious in the many ways they go that extra step to assist them to be happy and fulfilled at school. They are creative and enthusiastic and demonstrate to the children the importance of teamwork and commitment on a daily basis. Their love for their faith is one of their greatest assets, each bringing their own unique gifts to our community.

Lastly, may I wholeheartedly recommend the profession of teaching. The future of our world needs intelligent and faith filled people, who are willing to share their minds and hearts as teachers in our Catholic Schools.

God bless you and your families.



After School 'Drive Through'

In order for our afternoon 'Drive Through' to run as efficiently as possible we need your assistance by following these guidelines. Please:

- Have a clear label displayed in your front windscreen in <u>Large bold black texta</u> (highlighter and biro are impossible to read)
- Have children enter the car from the footpath only
- Avoid having children put bags in the boot (if another car accidentally accelerated your child could be crushed)
- Remain in your car as it is <u>illegal to leave your vehicle</u> in this area as it is 'NO PARKING'
- Make sure that your child/ren can fasten their own seatbelts (this is a requirement if using the 'Drive Through' service)
- Use the designated crossings around the school rather than crossing in between the traffic.

Please note that if you park outside the school or in Trott Street before 3 pm the parking officers have the right to ask you to move as this area is a NO PARKING AREA FROM 2.30PM—4.00PM.

We ask that you please follow the road signs and cooperate with our parking officers as we would prefer our parent community do not receive any parking fines.

Dear Parents/Guardians

St Patrick's Parramatta Swimming Carnival 2019

This year our St Patrick's Swimming Carnival will be held on **Wednesday 20**th **November 2019 at Granville Swimming Centre.** All students in **Years 2 to 6** will be expected to attend the Carnival and participate in either race events or novelty activities.

Depart School: 9:00am students will catch a bus to the pool and

prepare for a 9:30am start.

Depart pool: 2:00pm

What to wear: Students are advised to wear their swimming costume underneath their Sport uniform. Students may choose to wear a coloured t-shirt to represent their House colour. Students must wear a hat and either sandals or joggers.

NO THONGS WILL BE PERMITTED. Coloured **zinc** is **not** permitted.

Please complete the online permission slip to allow your child to attend the Carnival and return no later than Wednesday 13th November 2019. You must indicate whether your child will be competing in race events or in novelty activities only.

For your child to compete in race events they MUST BE A COMPETENT AND CONFIDENT SWIMMER ABLE TO SWIM 50m WITHOUT STOPPING. All students who nominate to compete will be assessed prior to the commencement of the carnival and given appropriate wristbands to wear. Students competing in race events will be given supervised free' time at the end of the Carnival in the 50m pool if time permits. If your child is not a confident and competent 50m swimmer please indicate that they will participate in the novelty events only in the smaller pool. They will be under the supervision of teachers and time permitting will receive a couple of sessions. STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN NOVELTY ACTIVITIES ONLY WILL NOT BE PERMITTED IN THE 50m RACE POOL AT ANY TIME OF THE DAY. The safety of students is paramount and therefore we rely on parents and students to demonstrate their full cooperation.

In order for our carnival to run smoothly we require the assistance of parent helpers to volunteer their time. If you are able to help on the day could you please indicate on the online form **asap or by Friday 8th November** to allow time for the organisation of duties. We appreciate the ongoing support our parents provide and are aware that without your help these days would not run as efficiently.

We look forward to another successful Carnival, weather permitting. Qualifying times for further representation will be based on the student's Heat Time. 50m Freestyle events will be raced in Boys and Girls age groups, however all other events will be raced in Junior, 11 Years and Senior Boys and Girls categories and the 100m Freestyle events in an Open Boys and Girls category.

Further information regarding what the students should bring to the Carnival, expectations and the organisation of the day will be sent home closer to the Carnival date.

Carnival Dismissal

Please be aware that this is a school event and therefore <u>all students are expected to attend the Carnival for the full duration of the day as if it were regular school hours.</u>

As the Carnival will run until close to the end of the school day (approx. 2:00pm) we will allow the students to be dismissed from the swimming pool if signed out and accompanied by an adult.

If you wish to take your child home from the pool or give permission to allow another adult to take them home from the pool can you please indicate on the online form so that their classroom teacher is aware of your intentions on the day.

Please understand that although you have indicated that you or another adult will be taking your child home from the pool at the end of the carnival, <u>you are still expected to approach your child's teacher prior to leaving the pool to have the child's name ticked off the roll.</u> Any parent of a child not ticked off will be contacted so we ask for your cooperation to avoid this unnecessary complication.



EXPLORING NUMERACY WITH YOUR CHILD

YEAR 3 TO YEAR 6—Watching the weather

Because it changes daily, the weather can be a great topic to discuss Maths with your child. Try these activities:
» Visit the website http://www.bom.gov.au/nsw/

- » Ask your child the difference between each day's minimum and maximum temperatures. Do they notice a pattern or trend in the weather changes?
- » Find a seven-day forecast, then record the actual temperature for each day and compare. Ask your child if the forecast was accurate. Ask them what similarities and differences they notice.
- » Use the information on the weather website to explore differences in weather between your area and other areas. Ask your child how much rain you get compared to other areas. Ask your child to identify differences in temperature between your area and other areas. Who might be affected by an increase or decrease in rainfall?

Parramatta Diocesan Primary students enrolled in Year 5 and 6 in 2020 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term Four in 2019 and in 2020. It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in years 5 & 6 in 2020 be invited to attend. To facilitate this, Parramatta Diocesan trials will be held in the following sports:

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au Click on "REP SELECTIONS" tab and scroll down to the SPORT you wish to register for and click on the "REGISTER" button below the heading "PDCPSSC Expression of Interest Registration Form". Each sport has a different registration criteria.

This online form is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST** for the 2020 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. You may complete this form to attend a selection trial or if you have been selected in a representative squad or team. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport and when completed, click SUBMIT.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and **MUST be approved by your child's school**. In order for your child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of your school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. **Please complete all fields and especially "Representative Experience"**.

Your child's school will notify you one week prior to the trial date if your child is to attend to the Parramatta Diocesan trial for their selected sport by providing a trial information sheet.

Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

\$10.00 trialling fee is payable to your school if your child has been approved and confirmed to attend the Parramatic Diocesan Trials.



2020 Team Sport Trials

Parramatta Diocese 2020 Information For Parents of **current** Year 4 and Year 5 students

Please note that the full day trials will be for boys cricket, boys soccer, boys rugby league & boys rugby union.

Due to the popularity of boys cricket, boys soccer and girls netball a maximum of 2 children only are eligible to trial from each school. Selection of the 2 boys and girls will be made jointly by the school sport coordinator and principal. Discretion can be sought.

Half day trial for tennis and netball... all other trials will be held after school beginning at 4pm.

MACKILLOP TRIAL

It should be noted that the main purpose of the Mackillop trial is to select a team to compete at the NSWPSSA Championships. The Inter-Diocesan MacKillop Trial is not a competition although a round robin format is often used to facilitate the selection procedure.

NSW PSSA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Children who are successful at being selected in the Mackillop team will compete at the NSWPSSA Championships. These championships involve three or four days of competition at various locations in NSW. Children selected in these teams may also be required to attend training sessions. At the NSW PSSA Championships a State team will be selected to participate at the School Sport Australia Inter State Exchange for some sports.

SCHOOL SPORT AUSTRALIA

To be considered for selction in the NSWPSSA state team for participation at all School Sport Australia 12 Years & Under championships: Students mus be turning between the ages of 10 and 12 in the year of competition i.e. Students turning the ages of 8, 9 and 13 in the year of competition are not eligible for NSWPSSA State selection.

Please note the following information:

- Parents are responsible for all transport and supervision arrangements and must remain to supervise their child at the trial at all times.
- Children need to generally be of representative standard.
- Attendance at training days, where applicable is compulsory.
- The selector's decisions are final.
- Parents will need to make their own travel arrangements for children representing Parramatta at Inter-Diocesan MacKillop trials. This may mean travel to Sydney, Wollongong, Canberra, Wagga or Forbes.
- Please be aware that the teacher conducting the trial and accompanying the team to the venue is a "Team Manager" ~ not a coach.

If you would like your child to participate in one of the Parramatta Diocesan trials please complete the Team Online Registration Form that can be accessed via the website www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au ~ Click on "REP SELECTIONS" tab and scroll down to the SPORT you wish to register for and click on the "REGISTER" button below the heading "PDCPSSC Expression of Interest Registration Form".

ALL OTHER SPORTS NOMINATIONS close Thursday 6th February 2020.

2020 school travel applications now open

Applications for student travel in 2020 opened on Friday, 11 October 2019.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 no longer need to re-apply if they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.



Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2019 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2019, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2020.
