Dear Parents and Caregivers

Last Friday night the children in Year 6 and their parents and siblings gathered in the hall at St Monica's Parramatta for their Year 6 Farewell Party. The children had such fun, dressing up, eating, laughing, dancing, signing autographs, taking photos in the photo booth, chatting with each other and cutting their cake. This very well organised event - thank you so much organising committee! - was designed to make the children the focus of the evening and they definitely succeeded.

During the course of the night I had the opportunity to say hello to most of the parents and the common theme of these conversations echoed the question; Where did the time go? I could not help but wonder at how hard it must be for parents to watch their little ones travel along the journey of growing up, knowing that if they have done their job at parenting well, there will come a time when their children will not need them as much.

Coincidentally the other day I heard a very moving reflection from radio commentator Amanda Keller about her role as a mother of a son, and one which left me very touched. She described the very difficult journey for parents as they slowly watch their children becoming independent adults, referring to the description of slowly 'breaking up' with them.

In my time in education I often see signs of this strain as parents experience significant moments in the lives of their children. These include; their first day at school, their first excursion by themselves, watching and listening to their original thoughts, all the way to the day they go to high school. Of course the path of growing up continues way past primary school and before you know it these children are enrolling their children back into the school they went to.

The life of a parent is certainly a life of sacrifice; you do what is best for your children even though at times it must break your heart. My respect and honour goes to each and every one of you and I pray that your good example, will be returned to you a hundred fold, through your children's respect and love for you always, especially in your elderly years - God willing!

This season of Advent, may I ask you to please keep in your prayers the families of children about to leave St Patrick's to journey on to high school and those that are preparing for their children to start school in 2020.

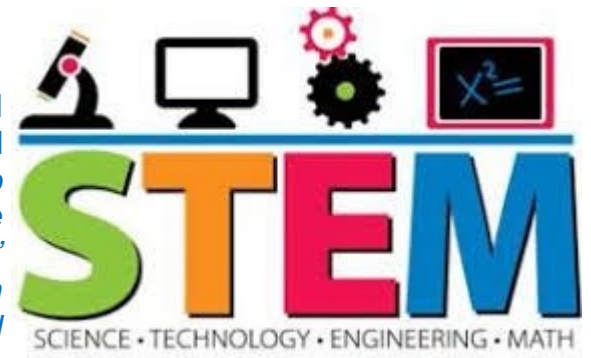
**Children's Mass

EXPLORING NUMERACY WITH YOUR CHILD

YEAR 3 TO YEAR 6 – Understanding Fractions, Decimals, Ratios and Percentages

Your child also begins to develop an understanding of the relationship between fractions, decimals, ratios and percentages.

Decimals – a fraction that is made by dividing a whole into ten equal parts (tenths) or one hundred equal parts (hundredths). For example, 75 red pens of 100 total pens can be rewritten as 0.75 or .75

Ratio – a comparison of two or more amounts. For example, in a fruit bowl there are 3 apples and 4 pears. This ratio of apples to pears is represented as 3:4.

Percentage – is the number of parts out of 100. For example, in a collection of 100 buttons, 75 are red. This can be represented as 75 per cent or 75%.

Talk positively about how you use fractions in everyday life. Making models of fractions for your child will support their understanding of fractions. Try some of these ideas by making use of everyday objects:

- Can you show me halves and quarters as you cut the orange?
- Can you cut up the apple to make six equal pieces? What fraction of the whole apple is one piece? Four pieces? How else could you say that?
- What percentage of the glass is filled with water? What is the ratio of water to air in the glass?
- How do the hands on the clock face show the time quarter past? Why do we use the word 'quarter' when telling the time?
- If you fold a towel three times equally, what fraction does it show?
