This week I wanted to again express my sorrow at the passing of one of our dear mothers, Louise, which occurred last Saturday, June 20th. I know from the many conversations I have had with other mothers in the school, Louise was a very valued member of the community and much admired for her positive attitude and friendliness. Even mothers who did not know Louise very well commented on how they used to love to say hello after school when she would pick up her daughter Ellen. I know the news last Saturday must have been very difficult to those who are Louise's friends and you must feel her loss deeply. Like anyone who has experienced grief it is hard to understand why these tragedies happen. All we can do is to continue to assure the family that the school community is there for them, especially young Ellen, in the days and years ahead.

The funeral for Louise will take place on Wednesday 1st June at Northern Suburbs Memorial Gardens and Crematorium at 1.30pm, however due to the COVID restrictions and the size of the chapel, attendance is limited to only 35 people - who will be invited family members only. 
SEMESTER ONE REPORT REMINDER

FROM THE LEARNING PIT

'Asks questions to deepen their learning'

When we think of questions within the classroom environment, we may picture students being asked them by their teacher; however throughout their schooling students questioning skills are continually being

developed. The importance of asking questions can never be underestimated - it is an essential part of the learning process. As students question unfamiliar concepts, they are in fact directing their learning by making connections between their prior knowledge and new information.

Students' questions play an important role in meaningful learning and motivation. The types of questions asked by students reveal their quality of thinking and conceptual understanding as well as confusions, their reasoning, and what they want to know. Expressing questions during learning is essential when problem solving and whilst trying to deepen their understanding.

As students' progress through their schooling, the depth of questions develop and lead to the ability to critically analyse issues and ideas.

Questioning may look different depending on the age of the student; Kindergarten students tend to ask factual and exploratory questions based on personal experiences whereas Year Four pose questions to help expand their knowledge of their world. By the time students' reach the end of their Primary schooling they are using questions to clarify, interpret and probe for information including causes and consequences. At all stages of schooling, asking questions deepens students' learning.

NEW REQUIREMENTS TO VOLUNTEER AT ST PATRICK'S PRIMARY, PARRAMATTA

Building Child Safe Communities - Volunteer Undertaking

Dear Parents/Carers

In Catholic Education Diocese Parramatta (CEDP), we see parents and carers as partners in your child's learning journey. Parents and carers are encouraged to become involved in our schools in many important ways such as supporting classroom learning, being part of advisory groups, mentoring programs, coaching sporting teams and supporting other extra-curricular activities, canteen support and other kinds of help.

A range of checks and undertakings are required for people who work for or provide services to CEDP. These checks reduce potential risk and form part of our strategy to build child safe communities.

CEDP has launched a new *Building Child Safe Communities* form and online training module that <u>all</u> <u>volunteers</u> are required to complete. The purpose of this training is to inform you of the standards of behaviour and other requirements that must be adhered to when volunteering for CEDP.

The undertaking should take no more than 5 minutes to complete and the training module approximately 10 minutes. Once the form and training modules are submitted, an automated email will be sent to you within two business days to confirm the status of your submission.

The undertaking form will expire within two years or when your Working With Children Check expires (if applicable), whichever is sooner. At that time you will need to complete the undertaking form and training module again. You will receive an automatic reminder email when this occurs.
