Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Last week and this week, classes were given the opportunity to undertake science experiments organised by the STEM leaders from Year 6. Many of you may have heard the term STEM which stands for Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths and is an area often enjoyed by children. Teachers in NSW follow the Science K to 10 Curriculum and this document looks at both natural and made worlds as well as the skills associated with knowledge and understanding across a range of contexts.

Some children are brought up in "science friendly" homes where children are encouraged to ask questions, explore their curiosities, watch science documentaries, explain their thinking, show critical thinking and problem solving and to create models. Science friendly homes are also homes that support a process and skills approach to mathematics where children are encouraged, not only to get the right answers, but to explain how they got them. This is the same approach as that used at school because we know that children become better learners when they are able to explain their thinking using language for concepts and understandings and in this process can identify when they are in fact unsure of the concept.

There are games that children can play at home that can assist them to develop the skills of critical thinking and problem solving.

These include:

- Tangram puzzles
- Mancala games encourage kids to count and strategize. Click <u>here</u> for a guide to the rules.
- Cooperative board games may foster social and critical thinking skills.
- Games that encourage children to draw a scene to explain their thoughts such as Pictionary.
- Games that ask children to sort or categorize develop logical reasoning.
- Puzzles and brainteasers such as jigsaw puzzles.
- Building blocks that encourage imagination and creativity.
- Marbles help children see cause and effect.
- Guessing games are great to build reasoning skills.
- Pretend play helps develop a child's language skills, social and emotional skills, nurtures their imagination and improves understanding of the world around them.

Why not get the children to turn off the TV or device and encourage them to play some of these games together.




Water Bottles

From the Learning Pit....

Reports are an important part of the communication between a school and parents. As we move towards a revised school report it is important for you to become familiar with the wording and layout of it so you can understand where your child is in their educational journey.



In the Semester 2 reports, English and Mathematics will include a dot plot displaying the different strands covered over the Semester. In English the strands will be written as:

- Speaking and Listening
- Reading and Viewing
- Writing and Representing

In Mathematics the strands will be written as:

- Working Mathematically
- Number and Algebra
- Measurement, Geometry, Statistics and Probability

The dots indicate the level of your child within that strand. It cannot be placed between two levels. The decision for the dot plot is to help parents understand their child's strengths and areas for improvement.

The different strands are from the NSW English and Mathematics syllabus.

Glossary of Terms

Speaking and Listening: the various formal and informal ways oral language is used to convey and receive information.

Reading and Viewing: Students in K–6 read, listen to and view a variety of texts that are appropriate to their needs, interests and abilities. These texts become increasingly sophisticated as students move from Kindergarten to Year 6. They respond to the texts in a variety of ways to show their level of understanding.

In each Year students study examples of: spoken texts, print texts, visual texts, media, multimedia and digital texts

Writing and Representing: planning, composing and editing texts that convey an idea. The complexity levels of the texts increase as the students move from Kindergarten to Year 6. Texts include examples of: written texts, visual texts, digital and multimedia text. (*pg 22, NSW English K-10 Syllabus*)

Working Mathematically: Students inquire, explore and connect mathematical concepts when problem solving. They communicate their thinking with reasoning.

Number and Algebra: develop efficient strategies for numerical calculations, recognise patterns and number relationships and make generalisations.

Measurement, Geometry, Statistics and Probability: identify, visuals and quantify measures and the attributes of shapes and objects. Collect, represent, analyse, interpret and evaluate data. (*pg 16, NSW Mathematics K-10 syllabus*)

Celebration of Learning: Year 3 Term 4 Week 2

This week, Year 3 is celebrating their learning in Mathematics. The maths they were focused on was Mass. Year 3 was exploring and investigating the weight of various objects and comparing weights using scales and other strategies such as hefting.

We interviewed some students about their learning:

Olivia 3L:

"We have been learning about how to find the weight of different things. We had a lot of different objects and fruits and vegetables to use to weigh and record the mass of the objects. It was a little challenging when hefting because the weight of some objects felt very similar. I am still in the Learning Pit and am trying hard to get out."

Owen 3L:

"In Maths, we have been learning about comparing the mass of two objects. We had to find out if the banana was lighter or heavier than the weights in the bucket. When we placed the 2 objects at each end of the equal arm balance scales we discovered the banana weighed less than 500g. We also investigated if the rockmelon was lighter or heavier than a 1Kg weight. We found out that it actually had a mass of 2Kg. I predicted that the rockmelon was heavier than 1Kg. I feel I am out of the Learning Pit for this as I am good at hefting and comparing and measuring weights."

Callum 3T:

"We have been learning about measuring the weight of different objects. This task was not really challenging for me because I know what 1Kg feels like and I predicted correctly when hefting. I was good at guessing what would be lighter or heavier when comparing before actually hefting or weighing the objects. I am almost out of the Learning Pit."

Antonia 3T:

"We are learning to estimate, measure, record, compare and order the mass of different objects. This task was not challenging for me except when we started using heavier weights like 1Kg as I am not used to this much weight. I am nearly out of the Learning Pit as I am getting better at hefting and weighing objects and can compare two objects."

Celebration of Learning: Year 4 Term 4 Week 2

This week, Year 4 is celebrating their learning in Dance. They are learning how to move to music focusing on the elements of dance such as beat, rhythm, spatial awareness, timing and movements to express their interpretation.

We interviewed some students about their learning:

April Soh:

"During Dance we are learning to perform locomotive and non-locomotor movements. I find this challenging because I don't usually dance. I enjoy Dance lessons sometimes because I enjoy dancing and moving to songs I know."

Gabriel Kalouche:

"We are learning about different aspects of dance as well as about locomotive and non-locomotor movements. One of the types of movements we are learning about is called a cannon effect. I find Dance easy and hard. Easy to learn the dance moves but hard to remember and perform them all in sequence."

Donnacha Ryan:

"I have learnt about locomotive and non-locomotor movements. I enjoy participating in Dance because it is a fun activity and I like working with my friends because they make it fun. I find some of the dance moves challenging but I get involved and try my best."

Gabriella Volante:

"We are learning about the different dynamics and elements of dance and about locomotive and non-locomotor movements. I find it easy and enjoyable but some moves are harder than others so can be challenging for me to perform, especially if they are new to me. The moves I am familiar with I find easy as I have perfected them."

Public Speaking and Communication

Speak To Children As Adults

Vicki Skyring – Principal of Superspeak

I have spoken to my children as adults since birth really, trying not to abbreviate words or speak in 'baby language' which has really helped with their speech development, both speaking at an early age with wide vocabularies.

I think it helps that my Mum was a teacher and I also lecture, so we've helped to support their learning from a young age. I think exposing children from birth to books and reading is crucial too, it starts them off on a journey of discovery, and finding joy in reading and using their imagination from day 1.

Celebration of Learning: Year 5 Term 4 Week 2

This week, Year 5 is celebrating their learning in Science and Technology and Geography. The students are learning about the causes of natural disasters and how technology has advanced to create helpful and effective mitigation strategies to decrease the devastation of natural disasters.

We interviewed some students about their learning:

Adrian 5C:

"For Science and Geography our class has been separated into groups of different natural disasters. My group is investigating earthquakes in Wellington, NZ. We are first answering questions about the location of the disasters. I am finding this research easy because I know a little about Wellington because my dad has been to Wellington so I am interested in learning about this. I am doing well at finding out the information I need to help me answer questions."

Zara 5C:

"In Geography, we are learning about natural disasters, where they have occurred in the world, how they occurred and information about the disasters. I am finding this task a little difficult to find the right information I need for my research. I do like this learning because it is challenging my thinking and I find learning about natural disasters interesting."

Clio 5T:

"In Geography we are learning about different natural disasters and how they affect the environment and what causes them to happen. This task is quite challenging because it is hard finding information about what causes them but it is easier to find information about how the environment gets damaged. I like this task because I love finding out about things to do with our environment and learning about different natural disasters."

Elie 5T:

"In Geography, we are learning about how natural disasters occur and how they can affect the environment. We get to select the natural disaster we want to investigate and research facts and scientific information about it. This task is both hard and easy because researching landforms is easy but identifying how they recovered after the disaster is harder. I like this task because I like researching geography and natural disasters."

Celebration of Learning: Year 6 Term 4 Week 2

This week Year 6 is celebrating their learning in Literacy in the area of Writing. They are learning about identifying and analysing significant elements, structure and language and grammatical features of an Informative Text (Explanation). They have been exploring many examples of various forms of explanation texts to help with their learning and develop deeper understanding.

We interviewed some of the students about their learning.

Ethan Bechara:

"We are learning about the features and structure of an explanation text. It is both easy and hard because I remember reading explanation texts before but I find some of the language features challenging."

Aaliyah Johnston:

"We are learning how to compose an explanation text. It is easy because I know the structure of an explanation and understand the language features. My next step is to think of more complex vocabulary to use to make my writing more interesting."

Christian Barakat:

"We are learning about explanation texts and how to accurately structure them. We are also analysing different explanations to help us learn about language of cause and effect, time connectives and technical vocabulary. I find the structure easy to understand but some of the language features are challenging."

Olivia Gebrael:

"We are learning how to sequence and structure an explanation text. We have also been learning how to identify language of cause and effect and what is known as a chain reaction of causes and effects. I find some of the language features challenging and I need to work on elaborating and explaining some of the technical words used in the text."
