Dear Parents and Caregivers,

November is such a special month, I believe, because we have 2 very special days of commemoration and mourning; All Soul's Day on November 2nd and Remembrance Day, today, November 11th. On both days we have the opportunity to stop for a moment and to think about our loved ones who have died and also for those who have died for their country.

In his homily at the Holy Mass in Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed this year, Pope Francis reminds us that our lives are but a journey; a journey that finishes with our very last step. He urges us to stop and be attentive to what is going on around us; to notice and to discern how our every step can bring about change. He exhorts us to create peace in our world; peace within our families and amongst our friends, in our own minds and in our hearts. Peace requires us to demonstrate patience and a seeking to understand the other. It requires us to have a willingness to enter into true dialogue with those that have a different point of view from us or a different way of life.

As already expressed in a previous newsletter, our current pandemic is far from bringing us peace and I have heard many comments on the lack of peace in people's lives, due to a feeling of change, disconnect and suffering. How can we bring about peace in these times?

Pope Francis goes on to link this journey of peace to that of the thousands of men and women who lost their lives.

I took note of the way our Holy Father focuses on the sadness of what happens when good people are used by greedy leaders. He states:

"These people — good people — who died in the war, they died because they were called to defend their homeland, to defend values, to defend ideals and, many other times, to defend sad and lamentable political situations. And they are the victims, the victims of war, that eats the children of the homeland."

As we soon await the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ, let us take up Pope Francis' challenge:

"I leave you with these two thoughts. "You who are walking, think about your steps, and of your steps, think about the final step": may they be in peace, in peace of the heart, all in peace. The second thought: these graves that speak, cry out, they cry out of themselves, they cry out, "Peace!".

May the Lord help us to sow and keep these two thoughts in our hearts."

HOLY MASS IN COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED HOMILY OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS

French Military Cemetery in Rome Tuesday, 2 November 2021 [**Multimedia** link]

A writing on the entrance door of a small cemetery which is up North comes to mind: "You who are walking, think about your steps, and of your steps, think about the final step".

You who are walking. Life is a journey, all of us are on a journey. All of us, if we wish to do something in life, are on a journey. It is not a stroll, nor is it a labyrinth, no, it is a journey. On the way, we pass in front of many historical events, in front of many difficult situations. And also in front of cemeteries. The advice of this cemetery is: "You who are passing by, halt your step and think, and of your steps, think about the final step". We will all have a final step. Some may say to me, "Father, don't be so mournful, don't be so tragic". But it is the truth. The important thing is that that final step finds us on a journey, not strolling around; in the journey of life and not in an endless labyrinth. To be on a journey so that the last step finds us walking. This is the first thought that I would like to say and that comes from my heart.

The second thought, is the graves. These people — good people — who died in the war, they died because they were called to defend their homeland, to defend values, to defend ideals and, many other times, to defend sad and lamentable political situations. And they are the victims, the victims of war, that eats the children of the homeland. And I think of Anzio, of Redipuglia; I think of the Piave River in 1914 — so many were left there —; I think of Normandy beach: forty thousand, in that landing! But it doesn't matter, they fell....

I stopped in front of a tomb: "Inconnu. Mort pour la France 1944" [Unknown. Died for France 1944]. Not even the name. In God's heart is the name of all of us, but this is the tragedy of war. I am sure that all these who went in good will, called by their homeland to defend it, are with the Lord. But do we, who are on the journey, fight sufficiently so that there will be no wars? So that the economies of countries are not fortified by the arms industry? Today the sermon should be to look at the tombs: "Died for France"; some have names, some others do not. But these graves are a message of peace: "Stop, brothers and sisters, stop! Stop, arms manufacturers, stop!".

I leave you with these two thoughts. "You who are walking, think about your steps, and of your steps, think about the final step": may they be in peace, in peace of the heart, all in peace. The second thought: these graves that speak, cry out, they cry out of themselves, they cry out, "Peace!".

May the Lord help us to sow and keep these two thoughts in our hearts.

Saying goodbye to School Banking

Sadly, our School Banking program will not be returning to schools in 2022.

School Banking is closing nationally

We're sad to announce that the CommBank School Banking program will not be returning to schools in 2022.

For 90 years, our School Banking program has helped children learn about money, reinforced the importance of regular savings and provided structure for parents to support their children to save.

We've had strong support from thousands of schools, parents and teachers across the country who choose to run our program. We're disappointed with the position taken by the Australian Securities and Investments Commission (ASIC) and subsequent decisions by some state and territory governments to take that choice away from individual schools and parents. Because of the ASIC review and these government decisions, we're unable to continue providing programs in schools, and we've had to make a difficult decision to close our School Banking program nationally for all schools, both government and non-government, across the country.
