Dear Parents and Caregivers

A couple of weeks ago I reported that the teachers in Kindergarten, years 1 and 2 will be undertaking Professional Learning in English and Mathematics in preparation for the implementation of the new K- 2 English and Maths Syllabuses in 2023. This week the focus is on Mathematics K - 2.

Some of the key areas of learning in the NEW <u>Mathematics Syllabus K-2</u>, which may be of interest to parents include:

- · understanding the symbols that represent quantity
- learning the sequence of counting words and making the association between the words and quantities
- learning different ways of representing quantity objects, words and symbols as well as understanding that ten (10), for example, is not only a word or symbol but a combination of different number pairs, such as 5 and 5, 4 and 6, or 3 and 7
- knowing how to use 10 and 100 as units[4]
- identifying links between measurement, space and number
- understanding how structures are organised and related
- being able to provide the reasoning behind the solution to a problem.

The diagram below shows the importance of the skills of Working Mathematically across all maths content areas. This includes the important skill of **being able to provide the reasoning behind the solution to a problem.**

NAPLAN NEWS

This year students in Year 3, 5 7 and 9 will participate in NAPLAN online. Year 3 complete Reading, Conventions of Language and Mathematics online. Year 3 complete writing with pen and paper. Year 5 complete Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language and Mathematics online. All students are required to use headphones during the test so they can hear verbal instructions without disrupting other students. Please ensure you have sent a pair of headphones to the school before Week 9 as they will also need these during the practice test held on Thursday 24 March 2022.

Can Students use paper to work out or plan answers?

Students can use paper to work out or plan their answers for the conventions of language, writing and numeracy tests. This paper is collected by the test administrator at the end of the test

If a student is sick, can they complete the test online at home?

As with the paper NAPLAN, students who are sick cannot complete NAPLAN at home. Students who are absent on the day of testing may be able to complete catch-up tests if they return to school within the NAPLAN test window.

Will students with limited keyboard skills be disadvantaged in the test?

The writing test is not about handwriting skills and NAPLAN Online is not about keyboarding skills. There are variations in how fast and well a student can type, just as there are variations in how fast and well a student can write by hand.

ACARA research shows that online writing is similar to handwriting in terms of the quality of writing produced by students at each year level. It also shows that students generally appreciates the use of online features such as editing tools (noting that online features such as grammar and spell-check are disabled during NAPLAN testing)

Students do not have to be able to touch type to successfully complete the test.

TIPS FOR HOME READING

If reading time is stressful, move the reading to a new location. Instead of sitting at the kitchen bench, move to the lounge room floor, or go outside and sit under a tree or take the books to the local coffee shop.

Helping your Kindergarten child at home with Mathematics

This guide from the new K-2 Mathematics syllabus can help you support your Kindergarten children at home.

Number and algebra


Representing whole numbers

Representing whole numbers focuses on:

- how whole numbers show quantity
- reading and representing numerals to at least 20.

You can help your Kindergarten child at home by:

- helping them represent numbers from 0 to 10 with words, numerals and finger patterns. For example, the number 5 would be represented as 'five', 5 and
- using household items to represent numbers 0 to 20. For example, counting out 15 pegs, 9 pencils, 11 marbles or 5 lollies
- counting objects you see while you are out walking. For example, you might count how many dogs you see, fence palings or flowers on a plant
- counting backwards by ones when your child is confident counting forwards. Practise the 'Rocket ship countdown 10–1
 Blast-off'
- using dice in board games to identify the number pattern
- playing a game of Bingo with the numbers 1 to 20
- playing Snap with a deck of cards
- identifying numbers on coins or letterboxes.

Lent for Families:

We may remember that as children, Lent for us meant forty days without lollies, or something else we really enjoyed. Many people choose to do something positive, rather than give something up. Talk with your children about Lent. It should be different from other times of the year. Whatever we decide to do, should change us and help us become more God-centred. Encourage your children to think of a plan for Lent.

Instead of their usual bedtime story, perhaps you could read a Bible story. Talk to your children about what keeps them from being good – where does their temptation lie? We all, including our children, have bad habits that we can try to overcome. As adults we can give up gossiping or bingeing on Netflix. For Children, trying to be polite, thinking of others and avoiding teasing would be a good thing for any household. In order to really celebrate Easter, we need to do some spiritual housecleaning during Lent.



What would Lent be like if all our families concentrated on acts of kindness?

Activity Idea: Cut up little slips of coloured paper and each time a member of the family performs a kind act, one of the papers is put in a container. When Easter comes, the coloured papers are glued on a cardboard outline of a butterfly. But even more striking than the butterfly will be the increased sign of God's presence in all who participated.

First Week of Lent

We begin our annual Lenten Project Compassion journey by learning about Anatercia, a 12-year-old girl living in a small village in southern Mozambique. She began to take on more and more adult responsibilities as her mother has chronic health issues. She did most of the household chores and had to travel up to five hours every day to collect clean water. Water scarcity also meant that harvests were poor and there was never enough to eat.

With your support, Caritas Australia's local partner, Caritas Regional Chokwe, was able to help Anatercia's family to irrigate their farm to improve their food security. They

also improved water access for households in the village, delivered sustainable farming training, and provided Anatercia with essential school supplies.

Anatercia's health, education and quality of life have improved, along with the outlook of her whole community for all future generations.




