I remember the feeling of great joy and a sense of peace and freedom as we walked back home.

I could see last Tuesday night that this sacrament held as much importance to our little ones as it did for my sister and I. That same sense of joy and peace was reflected in their faces as they returned to their seats beside mum or dad.

Pope Francis says this about Reconciliation:

The centre of confession is not the sins we declare, but the **divine love we receive**, of which we are always in need. The centre of confession is Jesus who waits for us, who listens to us and forgives us. Remember this: In the heart of God, we come before our mistakes.

And let us pray that we may experience the sacrament of reconciliation with renewed depth, to taste the forgiveness and infinite mercy of God.

NAPLAN NEWS

Students in Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 will participate in NAPLAN online next year from **March 15 - 27 March**. Year 3 complete **Reading**, Conventions of Language and Mathematics online. Year 3 complete writing with pen and paper. Year 5 complete Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language and Mathematics online. *All students are required to use headphones during the test so they can hear verbal instructions without disrupting other students*. *All students in Year 3 and 5 will need to send a pair of headphones to the school before Term 1, Week 6, 2023 to ensure all students are ready to participate in the NAPLAN test window*.

The following frequently asked questions answer some important information regarding NAPLAN. More information can be found at the NAPLAN Parent support page -

Can Students use paper to work out or plan answers?

Students can use paper to work out or plan their answers for the conventions of language, writing and numeracy tests. This paper is collected by the test administrator at the end of the test

If a student is sick, can they complete the test online at home?

As with the paper NAPLAN, students who are sick cannot complete NAPLAN at home. Students who are absent on the day of testing may be able to complete catch-up tests if they return to school within the NAPLAN test window.

Will students with limited keyboard skills be disadvantaged in the test?

The writing test is not about handwriting skills and NAPLAN Online is not about keyboarding skills. There are variations in how fast and well a student can type, just as there are variations in how fast and well a student can write by hand.

ACARA research shows that online writing is similar to handwriting in terms of the quality of writing produced by students at each year level. It also shows that students generally appreciates the use of online features such as editing tools (noting that online features such as grammar and spell-check are disabled during NAPLAN testing)

Students do not have to be able to touch type to successfully complete the test.

Students can access the demonstration site via the link below. This site gives them an opportunity to engage in the types of questions that will be used during NAPLAN.



Helping your child with all strands of Primary school Mathematics

Length and area continued

What you can do to help your child learn to measure

- Use modelling dough to roll out two 'snakes' of different lengths. Talk about one snake being 'shorter' and the other 'longer'.
- Roll two snakes that are the same length from modelling dough. Turn one into a zigzag or curved snake. Ask your child, 'Which snake is longer?'
- Trace around your child's hand or foot onto a piece of card and cut it out. Use this to measure the length of things such as a table or their bed. Before you measure, encourage your child to guess how many 'hands' long the bed is.
- Roll a toy car down a ramp and measure how many car lengths it travelled.
- Walk around objects and talk about how many steps it takes.
- Record your child's growth on a height chart.
- Compare the height of family members and talk about who is 'taller' and 'shorter'.
- Use a stick to measure distances between seedlings when planting.
- Measure the area of a patio or tabletop using sheets of newspaper. Count how many sheets of paper were needed to completely cover the area.
- Draw squiggle patterns or make squiggle patterns from string glued onto paper. Colour inside the 'closed' areas.
- Spread out a sheet of newspaper on the floor. Count how many books will fit on top of it.
- When wrapping presents, talk about the size of the paper and if the paper will be wide and long enough.
- Talk about the size of a tablecloth needed to cover a table or covering for a car.
- Look at the area coverage shown on paint tins before painting. Talk about how many tins of paint you will need.
- Collect coloured scrap paper and some empty cans or small cartons such as cereal boxes. Your child can create a colourful model by gluing paper to completely cover the carton or can.
- Show your child examples of patchwork and talk about the patterns. Encourage them to create patterns using blocks, scraps of paper or colouring on paper.

CONVERSATION STARTERS ABOUT CYBER SAFETY (link)

These tips are designed to be used in a family to start everyday conversations about online safety. The questions cover topics such as identifying online risks, using technology safely and reporting unsafe behaviour. Use them together with the information at eSafety kids, and empower kids to take control of their online experiences.

Robotic toys

From simple electronic 'pets', through to advanced kits for teens to design and construct their own unique robot, robotic toys can be used to learn and master valuable skills like engineering, maths and coding. Some robotic toys are controlled through specific apps on devices, while others may be internet-enabled or connected to smart home devices.

Age guide

There are robotic toys aimed at all ages and stages of development — from robot dogs for ages 5+, through to advanced robotics kits for dedicated enthusiasts in their late teens.

What to look out for

- Do some research to ensure you pick the robotic toy with the right level of complexity for your child.
- Robotic toys and accompanying user accounts may store personal information, such as your child's name, age, gender and, in some instances, location.
- These databases can be exposed to third parties including hackers revealing your child's personal information which may be exploited.
- Inbuilt cameras and microphones may record video or audio of your child.

How to stay safe

- Do some background research to get across any obvious safety or security issues.
- Update default usernames and passwords with stronger versions.
- Update software regularly.
- Deactivate any voice or video recording capabilities.
- Secure your home network; it's wise to change your wi-fi password on a regular basis especially if you're still using the default password.
- Only pair via Bluetooth with another device you are aware of and can control.
